Midwest Leadership Summit – Jan 2022

Just a couple weeks ago I was blessed to attend the MLS. It was a great gathering of more than 1100 from 12 states comprising 9 Baptist state conventions. 70+ training sessions along with several powerful plenary speakers highlighted the focus on advancing the gospel and growing the church through cooperation and partnerships for evangelism, discipleship, planting, and revitalization.

One important lesson continues to surface.
