# What's it really going to take to see our church become more effective and our community changed?

Back in January we sponsored and conducted a Strategic Planning for Church Leadership workshop which was attended by pastors and leaders from across Southeast MO. Each attendee was interested in answering that basic question which appears above.

The basic answer to the question is this: It is going to take the unified focus of every church member in becoming like Christ, equipped by the Holy Spirit for works of ministry and the building up of the body of Christ.

This all starts with each believer (YOU) coming before God in personal and unified prayer for His work and glory through their life. As you pray, God will move to help you gain the same vision, perspective, and goals as Jesus. As you pray, God will help you engage those who are lost without faith in Christ. As you pray, God will lead you to engage in the discipleship of new or young believers. As you pray, God will show you ministry opportunities with those around you. As you pray, God will enhance your times of worship – and God will draw you closer together with the body of Christ in fellowship and partnership.

Last month I challenged you to join me in a season of prayer leading up to Easter. On the  $22^{nd}$  I started that season of prayer – using the Guided Prayer material which appears on our CCSBA website. During these next weeks of prayer, my requests before God will not only be for myself, but each of you – my brothers and sisters – and the churches you belong to.

I believe God will do a mighty work in your life. I believe God will give you opportunities for sharing the gospel and discipling those who come to faith. I believe God will give you great opportunities for ministry, and to grow in fellowship / partnership with be body of Christ. I believe God will move and help you experience Him in greater ways as you

come before Him in worship. I believe we're about to see great and amazing things from our Father. I ask you to join me – to believe – and to experience.

Jas 1:20 "for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness of God."

Marriage research done by Doctors John & Julie Gottman has determined that the instruction in this scripture is especially useful in relationships (no surprise there)!

What do I mean by that? Gottman's research has determined that four kinds of communication are destructive to a marriage; so destructive that the Gottmans call them "the Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse". In giving them that name, they are telling us that when those show up regularly, the end (of the relationship) is near! They have plenty of research to support this.

What are these Four Horsemen? They are criticism, contempt, defensiveness, and stonewalling. Let's take a quick look at each one.


- Criticism has to do with the partner's character, not the thing they did that upset you. It is attacking who they are. Critical statements often begin "You always..." or You never...".
- Contempt This is the condition where you consider yourself superior to the other. You might mock, ridicule, or mimic to make the other feel despised and worthless.
- Defensiveness Typically a response to criticism; when you are defensive you will throw out excuses or play the innocent victim.

 Stonewalling – This occurs when one partner withdraws from the interaction and becomes silent.

Isn't it the "anger of man" that brings us to the point of criticism, contempt, defensiveness, and stonewalling?

Next time I want to talk about some antidotes to these Four Horsemen.
