Last month, I was able to take two of our African International students to the Association's CIA day at Southside Baptist where they were able to talk to all the children about Zimbabwe and educate them on our cultural differences and fascinate them with stories of lions, cheetahs and giraffes. I know the children were blessed by them but I believe Taps and John were the ones that received the biggest blessing. Both of these young men are Christians and I was able to spend the day with them and really pour into their lives. It was encouraging to hear about how God is working in the lives of Africans. I plan to talk with them and get their insight to help me plan an international student outreach later in April.
