Hello from the Baptist Student Ministry!

As the year 2020 trudges along, we find the world getting more divided by the minute. At the time of this 🚣 writing we have seen the death of George Floyd spark a chain of events that has included riots, vandalism, protests, and even several police officers being killed in the line of duty. When you turn on the evening news you will see some $\stackrel{\frown}{\star}$ point fingers at one side of the aisle, while others point their fingers right back at them with blaming accusations. It 🚣 is enough to make us angry enough to say and do things that aren't Christ-like, and the Bible calls that sin. One of the ways we can be lured into sin is when the issue of race is brought up. Whether we want to admit it or not, each of us were raised with our own worldviews and cultures, and those things do effect the way we view the world. It is in 🗼 these differing worldviews that racism can rear its ugly head.

When it comes to race relations, what is the response for born-again believers? Racism is defined as "a belief or doctrine that inherent differences among the various human racial groups determine cultural or individual achievement, usually involving the idea that one's own race is superior and has the right to dominate others or that a particular racial group is inferior to the others." Racism, at its root, is based in being a respecter of persons, viewing one group as less than another group. But how does God view racism? Acts 10:34 tells us, "Then Peter opened his mouth, and said, Of a truth I perceive that God is no respecter of persons." James 2:1 tells us that we should not hold the faith of our Lord Jesus Christ. . . with partiality (or by being a respecter of persons). Genesis 1:26 tells us that mankind was made in God's own image. Therefore, all colors of skin were created by God in His image.

The only conclusion that I can come to as a believer in the Bible as God's Word and the standard by which we 🖈 live, is that there is NO PLACE for racism inside the church or on the lips of professing Christians. We look around ★ and say, "This world needs Jesus!" Yes, it does. But you and I are the vessels by which God has chosen to take His message to the world. What message is the world hearing you proclaim? Are your words seasoned with salt (love) or 🖈 are they bland and tasteless? The world doesn't have a SKIN problem—it has a SIN problem. We know the only * answer to the sin problem is Jesus, and we must take the Gospel to everyone. The world doesn't have a RACE ★ problem—it has a GRACE problem. Church member: we need to extend the same grace to others as Jesus extended 🛨 to us. If we want to see real change, it must start with us. May our churches cease to be inwardly focused and focus ★ on fulfilling the Great Commission to every tribe, tongue, and nation.


