The college is also doing virtual classrooms on Zoom or other equivalent technology instead of face to face classes. Plus, overall enrollment is down from a year ago. This presents a great challenge to reach new students. So pray that the Lord would open up doors to reach more kids.

Also pray for the students that are attending every Monday night. Pray that they would be faithful to attend and also faithful to invite others and share Jesus with them.

Also pray for me as I attempt to lead the BSM. Many of you are probably not aware that I lost my full time job N back in March when Covid began, and I struggled to find employment for 4 months. 
