

Hello from the Baptist Student Ministry!

The school year is in full swing and the BSM has unfortunately experienced some recent setbacks. As I reported in last month's newsletter, I had planned to hold a cookout on campus to promote the BSM's free lunch Mondays and our bible study. We had hundreds of hamburgers ordered and were all set to cook on August 27 when the rains came and halted our plans. I rescheduled with the college for September 3 and was excited about the opportunity to meet the students. However, on Wednesday August 28 (one day after getting the approval from the college) I received an email informing me that "we can no longer hold BSM activities on PJC campus." Apparently the school has had this policy on the books for a long time and they had gotten relaxed in enforcing it, at least that was the reason given. Obviously this hit us with a mighty blow because our activities on campus is our way to get the word out to our students and promote the BSM. Last year we served an average of 60-70 students a free lunch on Monday. Our first Monday meal this semester saw only 21 students.

On a brighter note, our first bible study saw three new students attend and we had a total of 9 people in attendance. Compared to last year's 1 student attending on night one, that was a big victory!!

With this new reality we now face on campus, we are left with one obvious question: What do we do now? Do we shrug our shoulders and say, "oh well, it is what it is." Do we sit back and moan and groan about how it's unfair that we are facing a small level of persecution? Or do we pull up our boots and keep pressing on and running the race that is before us? I say we turn to the Lord and ask HIM to show up and do a mighty work. I say we unite in prayer for our students who are being denied the opportunity to hear about the gospel of Jesus Christ on campus because of the pressure of political correctness.

Will you join me on campus for an organized prayer walk around the PJC campus? I want to challenge every church to send several representatives to meet at the BSM on <u>Tuesday</u>, October 8 at 10 am. 
