ONE YEAR AND COUNTING...

Well, I have been your Director of Missions for a year this month. As I look back over my time in this office I see that about 90% of the things I hoped to accomplish remain undone due to the Covid-19 plague. It has curtailed many things in our lives as Christians – VBS, Mission trips, Youth Camps, retreats and even Sunday School in some churches. Churches and pastors have been forced to implement new ways to get the message of the Gospel out to the world and to disciple members. Covid-19 forced me to stop visiting our churches at the beginning of the pandemic, but I am returning to a schedule that will enable me to meet with the remaining 12 that I have not yet been able to visit.

Our Executive Board meeting was canceled in April of 2020 due to Covid-19, but we met in July at First Baptist of Paris. At this time we are planning an abbreviated and safe Annual Meeting on October 20, 2020, at First Baptist Clarksville. More information will be given in the October *Voice of the Valley*.

Some things that were accomplished include a Pastor/Staff luncheon held in October at Southside with Shane Pruitt speaking, and in February we hosted a Pastors & Wives Dinner with Tony and Vanessa Wolfe as guest speakers. By the time Covid-19 hit, I had visited 34 churches in our association. In July and August I met with several pastors to hear their plans for ministry during this troublesome time. In July I participated with black and white pastors for a time of prayer on the Square in Paris. I also have had the privilege of preaching in 5 of our churches this summer.

Honestly, I don't know how long this pestilence will continue, but I do know that our pastors and churches are resilient and will press forward with the ministry of the Gospel to our fallen world. I am thankful for the faithful pastors, staff, teachers, deacons and members of our churches that take their responsibility seriously and are busy about the Father's work.
