SACRAMENTS

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated Sundays after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. First time parents are asked to attend a welcoming session prior to baptism. Godparents are asked to present a sponsor card. Please call the parish office as soon as possible after your child's birth to plan his or her baptism.

The Sacrament of Marriage—engaged couples should notify the pastor at least six months prior to their proposed date. Couples participate in a preparation program.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick—please call the parish office for visitation of the sick at home, in the hospital, or health care facility.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is the official process used by the Church to bring adults into the Catholic faith.

Confirmation Class 2019 Registration

Confirmation registration forms (cream color) are now available for those students entering 7th grade or above in the Fall of 2017. Forms are being distributed at St. Agnes, at Sunday CCD class, and are also available on the table by the church entrance.

The Diocesan Confirmation program is a 2-year preparation program of study, prayer and service. All students desiring to prepare for and receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in 2019 MUST register at this time - Submit your registration by May 21, 2017. A student who is not registered this year is assumed will be registering next year to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in 2020. Confirmations will now take place each year rather than every three years – a two-year preparation program is required each time.





May is the Month of Marv

Mary: Something Dangerously New!

Traditionally, May is the month of Mary when we celebrate her unique place in salvation history. Because of God's initiative, through a young girl answering "Yes" to the unforeseen, the presence of God becomes vulnerable in human flesh. In the days of God's Old Testament people, it was the Ark of the Covenant that marked the presence of God. Now something new is happening: Mary of Nazareth is the tabernacle of God.

Like all mothers, Mary gives over her body and soul so that new life may be born. All mothers must wait for the gradual process that is happening within them; they must learn to let go of the child within them; they must not only nurture and protect the presence of the life within them, but also foster its leaving. The act of childbirth is

the painful act of letting go, so that the life within can take its own separate place in the life of the world. Mary's vocation is not only to hold Jesus within her, but also to let him go, to let him become the person he must be.

Mary assists the struggle of God to be one like us. There is something dangerously new about Mary, the woman at the centre of the Christian story. It is this woman, not a man, who brings God's real presence into the world. And through her, the presence of the Redeemer will be known and celebrated.
