Lectio Divina: The 4 Steps of Lectio Divina or Prayerful Reading

1. <u>Lectio</u>: Read a Scripture passage aloud slowly. Notice what phrase captures your attention and

be attentive to its meaning. Silent pause.

2. <u>Meditatio</u>: Read the passage aloud slowly again, reflecting on the passage, allowing God to speak

to you through it. Silent pause.

3. Oratio: Read it aloud slowly a third time, allowing it to be your prayer or response to God's gift

of insight to you. Silent pause.

4. Contemplatio: Read it aloud slowly a fourth time, now resting in God's word

This form of personal prayer takes some practice; however, it is well worth the effort, and most find that God does communicate with us and that it changes our lives. You may have noticed that the ARISE process uses a variation of this method of prayer.
