Be Aware - All Precautions Continue

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As the calendar turns to July this week, it is hard to believe just how much has changed in our lives over the last four months. With summer now upon us, things may be gradually returning to normal in some ways – but the threat of COVID-19 is still very present in our communities.

With the virus surging in many parts of our country, we need to be more vigilant than ever in exercising precautionary measures to keep us all safe. While all parishes in the Diocese of Scranton are now able to hold in-person Masses, this is not the time for us to let down our guard. I want to thank you – our faithful people, as well as all of our pastors and parish life coordinators – for your continued patience in following all of the safety protocols in your parishes.
