Letter from Bishop Bambera —Ordination of 8 Deacons in Diocese — November 28, 2020

I will ordain eight men to the Order of Deacon in St. Peter's Cathedral on Saturday, November 28, 2020, at the 10:00 A.M. Mass for service as permanent deacons in the Diocese of Scranton. The eight men and parishes of residence are:
