

**John 1:10, 14**

(v.10) "He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not.

(v.14) And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.

Here, in verse 10, it says the world was made by him, an act ascribed only to the Creator; GOD! Who made the world? The same one who, in verse 14 became flesh, and dwelt among man!

I Timothy 3:16 perfectly explains how God came to earth to pay the price for man:

"And without controversy, great is the mystery of godliness:

**God was** manifested in the flesh, justified in the spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory."

Only Jesus Christ meets each and every one of these criteria.

How could it be that every one of these statements point to Jesus, yet this verse states that "God was..." God and Jesus are inseparable. They are two of the three manifestations of God. In the old testament, God revealed Himself as Jehovah, God.

In the beginning of the new testament, God came down and manifested Himself in the form of Jesus Christ. Later, Jesus ascended to Heaven and sent His Spirit, the Holy Ghost, to fill and empower all who would accept Him. (see Acts 2:38-39, 19:1-6).

In closing, I'd like to refer back to the old testament prophecy in Isaiah 9:6. This testifies of the savior to come into the world:

*"For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, **The Mighty God, The Everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.**"*

Now that you have heard the truth about God, shouldn't you love Him, all the more? He, who would come down from His throne, to pay the price for all mankind? Won't you accept the truth over man-made doctrines?

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*"Coast to Coast With the Holy Ghost"*



*"Ye are my witnesses saith the Lord, and my servant whom I have chosen: that ye may know and believe me, and understand that I am he: before me there was no God formed, neither shall there be after me. I, even I, am the Lord; and beside me there is no savior."*

**Isaiah 43:10-11**

Much division prevails today on the subject of the Godhead. Some called trinitarians, teach that there are three separate persons in the Godhead, though they are united in spirit and purpose.

Some teach that there are 2 actual persons; the Father and the Son, and their spirit is the Holy Ghost.

Friends, let me start out point blank by saying to you, there is only ONE GOD!

Now, I know that there are those that will accuse me of denying the Father by stating that this One God is Jesus Christ, however, I am not denying the Father's existence; I'm confirming it!

Let's start by looking at the above scripture. *"You are my witnesses, saith the Lord, and my servant whom I have chosen..."* That's Jesus and the Father! Two, right? Wrong! Notice what follows: *"That ye may know and believe me (Believe who? God the Father.) and understand that I am he."* I am who? Jesus!

Let's go on:  
*"Before me there was no God formed, neither shall there be after me."* Jesus appeared later, in the new testament, and nobody could question His deity, but God said there shall not be another. What must this say of Jesus? He is God! Notice God goes on to tell Isaiah; *"I, even I, am the Lord; and beside me there is no savior."* Make no mistake about it, The Father and Jesus are one and the same!

### Isaiah 44:6-8

(v.6) *"Thus saith the Lord, the King of Israel, and his redeemer the Lord of hosts; I am the first, and I am the last; and beside me there is no God.*

(v.7) *and who, as I, shall call, and shall declare it, and set it in order for me, since I appointed the ancient people? and the things that are coming, and shall come, let them shew unto them.*

(v.8) *Fear ye not, neither be afraid: Have not I told thee from that time, and have declared it? Ye are even my witnesses. **Is there a God beside me? Yea, there is no God; I know not any.**"*

These are but a few of the prophetic words spoken by God of Himself. What is God's name? Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ literally interpreted means "Jehovah Savior"! Let's look at the new testament.

### John 5:39, 44-48

(v.39) *"Search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and these are they which testify of me."*

Now let's stop for one second to make a point. At the time that Jesus uttered these words, there was no new testament, only the old. Now; when Jesus said to 'Search the scriptures' in this verse, He had to be talking about the old testament because they were the only writings there were to be called scriptures. What did He say of them: *"and these are they which testify of me."* What? The old testament speaks of Jehovah God; the Father!

(v.44) *"How can ye believe, which receive honor one of another, and seek not the honor that cometh from God only?"*

(v.45) *Do not think that I will accuse you to the Father; there is one that accuseth you, even Moses, in whom ye trust.*

(v.46) *For had ye believed Moses, ye would have believed me: **for he wrote of me.**"*

What? You ask. How could that be? Moses wrote the first 5 books of the Bible known as the Pentateuch. When Moses wrote of his experiences, talking to God, he was writing of Jesus Christ.

Skeptics will argue that the scriptures make many references to the "Father and the Son." True, Jesus often mentions the Father, and the word declares He is the 'Son of God'. How could these 2 be the same person when clear distinctions seem to be made?

Let me start out by explaining the reason Jesus came to earth. Man, in his wickedness had become a stench in the nostrils of God. The old method for forgiveness of sin was through an animal sacrifice of a spotless lamb. Through wickedness in the priestly hierarchy, the sacrifice became nothing more than a ritual to the people, and was no longer pleasing to God. A one time sacrifice was needed to cover sin once and for all. Therefore, through a virgin birth, He formed a spotless, undefiled vessel that He might dwell in and walk among man .
