Dear Church Family:

One of the most difficult ministry challenges of all is saying goodbye to a Church family you have loved and been loved by. Words seem utterly inadequate to express the feelings Heather, Jessenia and I hold for you. I pray the Holy Spirit who lives in each of us may somehow carry the depths of our love from our hearts to yours.

As you all know, I have been appointed by Bishop Sharma Lewis, effective July 1st to serve as the District Superintendent for the

Harrisonburg District. In response to what I have fully come to embrace as God's will, I have accepted.

I have always prayed that God would allow me to be in ministry with Mount Olive and Relief long enough to make a difference. I believe God has allowed us to make a difference together in ministry for which I am so grateful and blessed.

As I reflect on the first reactions, I saw tears of joy for the opportunity this represents sadness and let me just say... disappointment. I certainly understand the disappointment as I try to wear those shoes. Many of you felt disappointment as we were together moving forward in making disciples of Jesus Christ, and becoming a congregation that matters to the community. Some of you felt cheated by the institutional church because pastoral continuation may seem pivotal in the success of ministry. But remember that God is in control. Remember that as a church you have a great potential and it is up to you to realize the potential, the other choice is go back to declining. Remember to put the vision first, put your entire trust in God and do not let your fears take control. Allow the Holy Spirit to be in control.

I will depart Mount Olive and Relief with the confidence of the following: Page 2 January 2018

First, you both are an awesome Church and God has great plans for you. Your obedience to our Lord during this time together has brought you to a place of abundant fruitfulness. I believe your impact for God's Kingdom can be even stronger in the days to come than in the days gone by.

Second, the path ahead is clear. Even though you will face a transition of senior pastor leadership, there is in no way a leadership void is present in these great two Churches. Your lay leadership is prepared to pursue and fulfill the vision of making disciples of Jesus Christ, which God has put in the heart of these two congregations and in you individually. You have a vision; you have physical plans, ministry plans, financial plans and spiritual plans. Follow them in God's power and "watch and see" what God will yet accomplish!

Finally, more than anything, I am confident of the love you have for our Lord and for one another. And I am even more confident of the love God has for you. My prayer is that, if there is any legacy from my tenure of service at Mount Olive and Relief, it will be a deep and abiding awareness of the power of love to change our lives and to change the world.

You will always remain in my heart and in my prayers. Now remain in Christ, knowing that He will remain in you, and allow the Holy Spirit to overcome any fears you may encounter and always remember that God is in control.



FEBRUARY SPOTLIGHT

The year 2017 was a very important year in the life of our Church in the ministry of Mission/Outreach with many hours spent on various projects and special donations. I had hoped to have a full report this month, but that just hasn't been possible, so I will try hard to have it for the March report.

Our spotlight is on the Heart Haven Homes. In the Virginia Conference of the United Methodist Church, February is Heart Havens Month! Each year, a theme for Heart Havens Month is picked and then carries throughout the year. In 2018, the theme is "Life of the Party," after Luke 14:12-14. This month's <u>Advocate</u> is celebrating Heart Havens month. Make sure you read your copy.

On September 24th, 1995 the Virginia Commission on Disabilities conducted twenty-one public hearings across the conference of Virginia to explore the residential needs and alternatives for persons with developmental disabilities. As a result of those hearings, Heart Havens was created at the Virginia Annual Conference in 1996.

Heart Havens was licensed in December 1998 and opened its first home in Virginia Beach on January 25th, 1999. Heart Havens is a ministry of the United Methodist Church that provides for the residential needs of persons with disabilities through the development and management of homes which exemplify the love of Christ. This ministry is accomplished by: Establishing and

promoting a conference-wide effort to address the residential needs of persons with disabilities; Involving local churches in a significant conference ministry; Encouraging client involvement in the life of the community and it's church; Respecting the individual's uniqueness, dignity and worth; Ministering to the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of each resident; Understanding the concerns and needs of each resident's family; and, Affirming God's love and care for all of God's people.

<u>Vision</u> — Heart Havens was created as a not-for-profit agency, to provide residential alternatives for disabled persons of all faiths, backgrounds, and not just those of the United Methodist denomination. Parents need the assurance that their children will have a place to live after the parents are gone. They are searching for quality programs for their children and desire a spiritual based program and home for them. Heart Havens hopes to assist in reducing the long waiting lists for services and ease the anxiety of elderly parents caring for their developmentally challenged adult children.

There are presently twelve homes, with more being planned and developed throughout the conference. They are located in Virginia Beach; Kilmarnock; Norfolk; Stuarts Draft; Colonial Beach; Richmond (2); Winchester; Lynchburg; Goochland; Newport News; and, Ashland. These homes, as well as future homes being planned or developed, could use your on-going and generous, financial; prayerful; and thoughtful support!

Our local Heart Havens home in Winchester, is located at 3050 Saratoga Drive, in the Kernstown area. It accommodates the same five (5) residents who have occupied the home since its construction and occupancy in Nov 2002! They are: Charles Hale,

J L Snider, Danny Smith, John Mason and Stephen Tarrant, who — along with the Staff, provide "a home" atmosphere in a typical residential neighborhood. They love to have visitors come by to visit and tour their home! As with all God's work and creation; you will receive a much greater blessing from your supportive efforts than you will ever provide! Make their Day! Visit them and tour "their home"! You'll be forever, glad that you did! I would like to schedule an event with our local group, maybe our summer picnic, a game night, etc. Any suggestions would be appreciated. We have money budgeted to benefit this very special home.

We will be serving the evening meal to the WATTS program on Monday, March 12th. I need to have seven adults to help prepare and serve the meal. Please contact me if you are interested.

The card signing will continue under the leadership of Debbie Fauble and will on the third Sunday. Cards will be available before Sunday School in the Fellowship Hall and immediately after Worship in the Willing Workers Classroom.

Thanks for all your support in 2017 and I hope we can count on your support in 2018.
