#### OUTREACH SPOTLIGHT SEPTEMBER 2020

Well here we are again, not knowing how things are going to figure out with schools, churches, the virus, etc. The only thing, we can be sure of is that God is in control.

Sunshine cards continue to be sent out monthly. Approximately forty are mailed each month.

C-CAP is still closed, but very active behind the closed doors. They are holding food drives, holding food drives in the mobile ministry by taking food drives to Sandy's trailer court, Senior complexes, Shawnee Land, etc. They have held and continue to hold various food drives, diaper drives and even pet food drives. Another diaper drive is planned in the next couple of weeks. Diapers size 4, 5 and 6 are needed. . These items can be delivered to the front office of C-CAP. Monday thru Friday, 11:00 am to 1:00 pm. They are not accepting clothing donations or food donations yet. All the food given in these food drives comes from the USDA. I took two cases of bottled water, baby wipes, and diapers to be used where needed. Right now, they are asking for umbrellas and rain ponchos for the homeless. If you want to donate either of these, bring them to church and I will see that they are delivered to C-CAP.

At the moment, it is hard to determine whether or not there will be a Weekday Religious Education Class this year, with the current schedule. I am guessing that it will not be held. I haven't heard anything regarding this, so I will wait a little while before determining whether or not to send our yearly donation.

Since things are unknown with the Our Family program, I will probably need help with the I00 Veterans Day bags. This includes decorating the bags, bagging candy etc. I have contacted the VA Center at Kernstown and have been given the go ahead for this year.

The district is still trying to work out collecting the school kits and hygiene kits, so if you

have hygiene kits, just bring them to church and give them to me.

Now is the time to start thinking about the Operation Christmas Child Shoebox and the blanket drive.

Shoeboxes are going to be in greater need, with so many parents out of work.

As you Annual Conference Delegate, I will be attending the virtual conference on Saturday, September 19<sup>th</sup>.
