- b. Memorial Day was first observed informally after the Civil War. First Proclaimed by Gen John Logan, Commander of the Union Veterans Group, The Grand Army of the Republic, in 1868. Many Southern States recognized Confederate Dead on a separate holiday called Confederate Memorial Day until After WWI when Memorial Day shifted to from a remembrance of Civil War Dead to the dead of all American Wars.
- c. Remember the over 1.3 million men and women who have giving their lives for our country over the last 241 years.
- d. One trait that these men and women had was courage.
- e. We might not be called upon to give our life for our country but all of us require some type of courage to face life

II. COURAGE

- a. Faith is the absence of doubt but the decision to move forward in the face of doubt
- b. So, Courage is not the absence of fear but the willingness to move forward in the face of fear

- f. Over and Over the Bible tells us not to fear:
 - i. **Deuteronomy 31:6** Be strong and of good courage, do not fear nor be afraid of them; for the LORD your God, He is the One who goes with you. He will not leave you nor forsake you.
 - **ii. Psalm 27:1** The LORD is my light and my salvation; Whom shall I fear? The LORD is the strength of my life; Of whom shall I be afraid? (NKJV)
 - iii. **Psalm 34:4** I sought the Lord, and He heard me, And delivered me from all my fears..
 - iv. Psalm 34:7 The Angel of the Lord encamps all around those who fear Him and delivers them.
