- c. A True Friend Loves (1)
 - i. Love is patient, love is kind. Love does not envy, is not boastful, is not conceited, 5 does not act improperly, is not selfish, is not provoked, and does not keep a record of wrongs.6 Love finds no joy in unrighteousness but rejoices in the truth. 7 It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. 8 Love never ends.. 1 Cor 13:4-8 (HCSB)

 - i. Translated in KJV 63 times
 - 1. understand 12
 - 2. wise 12
 - 3. prosper 8
 - ii. Proverbs 10:19 When there are many words, sin is unavoidable, but the one who controls his lips is wise (sakal).
 - 1. Control your tongue.
 - 2. Know how to keep your mouth shut.
 - iii. Proverbs 21:11 When the scoffer is punished, the simple is made wise; But when the wise is instructed (sakal), he receives knowledge.
 - 1. To be teachable.

 - ii. Why are we jealous?
 - 1. Because we see someone who is better than us. In them we see our own weaknesses.
