Beyond Sunday

I am going to be honest with you. If we want to grow as a congregation and reach out to others with the saving grace of God that we have come to know deeply as Lutherans, we must be willing to grow ourselves. What that means, is that one hour of worship on Sundays simply does not cut it. It is what we do beyond Sunday that grows our faith and relationship with God. The Apostle Paul knew how important it was to grow spiritually, and in his first letter to the Corinthians, he writes,

And so, brothers and sisters, I could not speak to you as spiritual people, but rather as people of the flesh, as infants in Christ. I fed you with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for solid food. Even now you are still not ready, for you are still of the flesh. As long as there is jealousy and quarrelling among you, are you not of the flesh, and behaving according to human inclinations? (1 Corinthians 3:1-3)

Paul's address to the people of Corinth may be blunt, but it gets to the point that we cannot expect to immediately have everything figured out. To know God is a true journey that can take years, yet one that must begin at some point if that is our desire. Like an infant, we cannot eat solid foods right away and must move towards eating richer and more enticing foods.

Beginning this September, I am inviting you into the opportunity to get to know God and thus grow in your faith in ways that we have talked little about in the past. Our conversation will begin on **Wednesday**, **September 18 at 7:00 pm.** Our discussions will be many-faceted and may lead to the formation of smaller groups. I am also offering the opportunity for you to individually grow in your faith and relationship with God through Spiritual Direction. This would be at scheduled times (at least once/month) that worked for your schedule.

Join us on Wednesday's at 7:00 pm to enter into this incredible journey as we move beyond Sunday.


