Walking in the Footsteps of Jesus

I have just returned from my educational trip and pilgrimage to the Holy Land to walk in the footsteps of Jesus. Returning home on my flight, my head and heart was full of a great week that is going to take a little while to digest and discern what it means.

Traveling throughout Israel provided a wonderful opportunity to meet some of the people and appreciate their hospitality. I traveled with a great group of ecumenical pastors that all had the same desire as myself. Our tour guide spoke of the Holy Land as being the fifth gospel. Of course, we have Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John which provide us the stories and parables of Jesus' life. Adding the fifth gospel, as Hussam told us, was the experience of walking in many of the places that Jesus and the disciples walked and ministered as they shared the love of God to the many people of Israel nearly two thousand years ago.

After traveling to the Holy Land, I was told you begin to look at the rest of the gospels a little differently. It has not taken me long to appreciate this as I read the gospel lesson from Matthew for this coming Sunday. Jesus calls the first disciples while they were preparing to go out onto the Sea of Galilee. The very waters that I had the occasion to go out onto myself this past week. Being in Capernaum, I can only imagine the detailed conversation that took place as Jesus invited Peter, Andrew, James, and John to follow him.

Thank you for allowing me the time to go. I also give thanks to Pastor Lauren and Pastor Rol for sharing the Good News with you on the two Sundays I was gone. As we approach Lent, I am looking forward to the gospel being opened for me in new and exciting ways, and I can't wait to share that with you.
