As professionals, pastors are expected to be involved in continuing education yearly. Part of Pastor Alex's continuing education this year was his trip to the Holy Land in January. This trip was paid for out of his own pocket. Due to our smaller budget, Trinity is not quite up to synod recommendations for a continuing education budget. An additional continuing education opportunity has presented itself to allow Pastor Alex to become a better preacher by working with a sermon mentorship program over the next year. This is an indepth one on one opportunity that is not offered in seminary. The cost of the program is \$3490. Thank you to the four families that have already committed to helping. This continuing education opportunity will assist Pastor Alex in becoming a better pastor and preacher which will benefit the congregation.
