On Wednesday evenings during Lent we will talk about the importance of words, how they affect our lives and how they shape what we do. For those that want, bring your dinner (like a brown bag lunch) and we will gather at 6:15 pm to share with one another those issues and concerns that are presently on our minds. We will worship at 7:00 pm with a focus on finding meaning in the words that shape us.

During our Sundays in Lent, we will begin a Bootcamp for the Soul! Lent is a season of reflection and change. Reflection and change take work, hard work. Lent can be like a boot camp for the soul, a restart in a focused area. You are invited to walk this season with one another, demanding the best of ourselves, ready to support one another, and prepared to see truths that shatter our self-understanding.
