HOLD EVERYTHING! HERE WE HAVE A WINNER!

Jesus didn't look much like a winner, battered and bruised, hanged naked on a Roman Cross. But appearances can be deceiving. Everyone, including the disciples, thought that it was all over. But they were so wrong. You see, on Calvary's Cross we have a winner!

For something as imposing as death, it didn't take Jesus very long to undo it. We think of Jesus being three days in the grave; and, as a child, I thought the three days was seventy-two hours. But it was nowhere near that long. Jesus died the ninth hour of the sixth day. The Hebrew day was divided into twelve equal parts from dawn to dusk. So, the hour was different lengths at different times during the year. The Passover being near the vernal equinox, the daylight was close to what we measure as twelve

hours. Therefore, we know that Jesus died at around midafternoon, a few hours before sundown.

The Jews' day began and ended at dusk rather than midnight, and the Jews accounted any part of a day as one day. Our Lord was entombed just before dusk on the sixth day (Good Friday), day one. He arose somewhere between dusk on the first day (Saturday evening) and dawn on the first day (Sunday morning), day three. On the seventh day, the Sabbath, He rested. So, the body of Our Lord lay in the tomb somewhere between twenty-five hours and thirty six hours. When contending with our Lord, death, hell and the grave was pretty much a wimp. For the Christian, death has been a wimp ever since.

The thing that impressed me most when my Dad passed was the fact that death was such a wimp; even though Dad's death was very difficult, involving a lot of pain. Satan has come face to face with the King of kings, Lord of lords, and Ruler of the universe. He owns the cattle on a thousand hills. The whole earth is His, and all that is in it. The universe cannot contain Him because the creator is forever greater that the thing created. Death and hell cannot contain Him, and it is for sure that no grave or stone can contain Him.

Jesus, warrior of the soul; victor over death, hell and the grave; creator of all, both seen, and unseen, is alive today and wants to reside in our hearts and lives. He is our redeemer! He purchased our pardon from sin and won the ultimate victory over Satan. In Him, we are more than conquerors over sin and death and anything that Satan employs to separate us from God's love. (see Romans 8:35 -39.)

Because Christ is for us, nothing and nobody can stand against us. We need not have any fear in the spiritual battles in this world. Because for us to live means Christ, and to die means that we will know Christ even as He know us. (See 1 Corinthians 13:12.) Continued page 5. 4

He Lives!

According to Alfred Smith, Rev. Alfred Ackley was preparing for Easter service in 1932. Listening to the radio he heard a then liberal speaker from New York make the statement, "...it's Easter! You know it really doesn't make any difference to me if Christ be risen or not. As far as I am concerned His body could be as dust in some Palestinian tomb. The main thing is, His truth goes marching on!"

Rev. Ackley responded to the radio, "It's a lie!" His wife heard and asked why he was shouting so early. That morning he preached as never before and returned that evening to continue his thoughts. Rev. Ackley had been asked by a Jew to whom he was witnessing for several weeks "Why should I worship a dead Jew?" To which Rev. Ackley replied, "That's the whole point. He isn't dead—He's alive!" This liberal preacher had by so few words undermined the source of power, and the reason for sacrifice of so many in the early church—"a resurrected, living savior!"

Returning home after service that evening, Rev. Ackley's wife challenged that it was time for him to do that which he did best—write a song. "Then you'll have something that will go on telling the story." And that is exactly what Alfred Ackley did. He went back to Mark 16:6 and read, "He is risen; He is not here!"

"A thrill filled my soul—a glorious living presence right there in the room with me, I could hold back no longer and began to write.

I serve a risen Saviour, He's in the world today.

I know that He is living,

Whatever men may say.

"On and on I wrote until within a comparatively short time, all the stanza lines and thoughts had fallen into place. Then as I sat down at the piano, the words and melody of the chorus followed immediately—just as they are today."
