impactyadkin 2019 June 15-22

This month our Youth will participate with **impact Yadkin** as our annual mission venture. It is only a couple of weeks out and God is moving in some amazing ways. I would like to take a few minutes to introduce to those of you who may not be aware the opportunity and impact this week of ministry can offer.

What is **impact Yadkin**?

impact Yadkin is a collaboration of volunteers from several different churches whose mission it is to share the message of Jesus Christ and His love with the people of Yadkin County. In addition to reaching out in the community, **impact** desires to see students and adults grow in their relationship with Christ through nightly worship, Bible study, missions, ministry and outreach.

Supported by several area churches of differing denominations, this event takes place during one week in June. The primary area of ministry is to provide home repairs to those in need.

Eligible home repair projects are identified through an application process with the aid of local churches, Yadkin County Department of Social Services, Aging Planning and YVEDDI.

The biennial event began in 2011 with approximately 400 volunteers completing 55 home repair projects.

In 2013 over 600 youth and adult construction volunteers completed 75 home repair projects.

In 2015 forty-three churches provided 776 construction volunteers who completed over 100 home repair projects during the **impact** event. Also, local churches have come together to complete several projects after the event.

In 2017 forty-six churches with over 700 volunteers completed 124 home repair jobs during and after the **impact** event.

In addition to construction crews, another 800-900 volunteers provide support (prayer, *Party in the Park*, meals, water, evangelism, clean-up, video, publicity, administration, etc.) during each **impact** event.

Party in the Park events (similar to backyard VBS) have also had an impact on our community. In 2013 park events were held in five locations throughout Yadkin County. These events had over 65 volunteer leaders ministering five days to an average of 230 children in grades 1-6.

In 2015 the *Party in the Park* ministry grew to seven locations covering a large portion of the county.

Reaching even more people in 2017, *Party in the Park* ministered in eight locations during

condom distribution, abortion and income assistance. Instead, we need to break the cycle of single-mother households with programs that encourage marriage and strengthen families.

If you were blessed to grow up in a home with a father, be thankful. If you still have a father, let him know that he is loved and respected. If you were reared by a stepfather, grandfather or adoptive father, you should be equally thankful.

If you are a young person who will someday be contemplating marriage and a family, decide right now that you will seek the Lord's guidance as you search for the person to share your life and your faith "for better or worse, for richer or poorer, in sickness and in health, until death alone, parts you."

Well, this is something to think about.

OUTSTANDING VOLUNTEER

A VOLUNTEER is a person who is a light to others, giving witness in a mixed-up age, doing well and willingly the tasks at hand—namely, being aware of another's needs and doing something about it.

A VOLUNTEER is a person who remembers to do the thing to make other people happy, who takes the loneliness out of the alone by talking to them who is concerned when others are unconcerned, who has the courage to be a prophet and to say the things that have to be said for the good of all.

A VOLUNTEER is a person whose charity is fidelity, who is faithful in an unfaithful world, grateful in an ungrateful world, giving when all about are grasping, listening when others need to tell about their fears and problems.

Fathers Matter

What was the first institution ordained by God? The answer, of course, is marriage. Something has happened to marriage and something has happened to the idea of “manhood” and “fatherhood.” Today, more than ever, we need men who will say with Joshua, ...”But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord.” (Joshua 24:15)

Far too many of our nation’s children are being raised without the presence of their biological fathers. They are growing up with no opportunity to know or interact wit the man who bequeathed his genetic heritage. Too often the biological father is not around to guide, protect and teach his children.

Obviously, many children who grow up in a mother-only family do well, and many single mothers are heroic. But the social science data is clear and unequivocal that biological fathers in healthy, intact marital relationships are vital in the lives of children and the teachers all over our local pubic school systems highlight this fact. And, yet, our would-be societal leaders ignore it as though it isn’t even happening!

Sigmund Freud, who was hardly a right-winger, or even a Christian, said many years ago, “I cannot think of any need in childhood as strong as the need for a father’s protection.”

Data from the National Principals Association Report strongly suggests that Freud is right. Sixty-three percent of youth suicides occur in households lacking a father. This is five times the overall national average. Likewise 77% of youths in state-operated institutions, nine times the overall national average. Eighty-five percent of children with behavioral disorders— 20 times the overall national average; and71% of all high school dropouts are in fatherless homes. Seventy-five percent of the adolescents in chemical abuse centers and 85% of youths in prison come from homes without a father’s presence.

The issue is not simply poverty. Expanding efforts to address poverty alone in fatherless households have not improved the data. Clearly, the issue is the presence of a father.

Clearly, the policy that will break the vicious cycle between unwed childbearing and poverty is anything but more government-funded

impact week. This year we will host 11 locations with the possibility of reaching over 400 children with the life-saving message of Jesus Christ.

As of May 20 there were over 153 requests for jobs to be accomplished, 630 construction participants making up 63 crews with 42 churches involved. We have 11 *Party in the Park* locations. No one has reached the age of too old to minister, therefore all are welcome. Please not only be in prayer for this mission, but if God is calling you volunteer to take part in the unhindered blessing that will flow from participating, please see me.

When Isaiah heard heaven ask “Whom shall we send,” he didn’t say “send the young or those who have time.” He said “Send me.” This is a great opportunity for you to say “yes” to God.

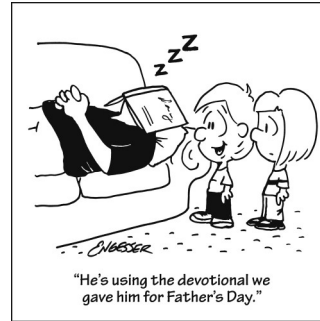
