



Repentance and Communion Go Together Pastor Brady

Lent in the church year is a time that is highly emphasized in churches with more set forms of worship and liturgies. It begins about six weeks before Easter on Ash Wednesday (March 6 this year). It is a period set aside as special days for penitence; a time for admitting to God our failures (shortcomings, sins), seeking His forgiveness and rededicating ourselves to the doing of His will. It is a time of self-denial to remind of all our Lord put aside to come as a man to earth to redeem us. Of course, the time for penitence and repentance is any time God shows us our weakness,

Admitting sinfulness and failure fell into great disrepute in the late sixties and early seventies for fear of damaging egos. In the early 1970's I was attending Virginia Commonwealth University School of Social Work. During our second year one of my fellow students seemed to have lost his focus and was pretty much drifting along in his academic work. He wasn't failing to complete assignments and wasn't missing large numbers of classes. He just wasn't putting forth the type of effort that he should put forth.

failure and sinfulness—not just at Lent.

His faculty advisor summonsed him, presumably for the purpose of offering advice. In fact, he was given clear advice as to where his effort was likely to lead. As he described the meeting, he concluded reflectively, "You know. Sometimes there is nothing quite like a good swift kick in the fanny to get you going."

In Revelation 3:19 Jesus said, "Those whom I love I rebuke and discipline. So be earnest and repent." We aren't supposed to be rebuked, are we?! The word means to scold or criticize sharply. Rebuke is uncomfortable, so it must be wrong. But Jesus says that He rebukes those whom He loves. Jesus who suffered scourging, humiliation and death on the cross because He loves us also rebukes us!

But, read on: "Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with him, and he with me." Jesus wants to have genuine relationship with you and with me. He wants to come into our hearts and teach us. He wants to show us where we are wrong, and He wants to have communion with us.

I remember fondly my parents' firm discipline that occurred more often that I care to admit. I was a very slow learner when it came to behavior. I remember even more fondly those hours
