Greetings in the NAME OF CHRIST!

What is the Gospel? We say we know, or we think we know, what the Gospel is, but do we really know? According to Dr. John Saunders, Prof of Evangelism at Campbell University Divinity, that studies consistently show that 85% of Southern Baptists only have a half-truth when it comes to knowing and understanding the Gospel. So, let me ask you, do you know what the Gospel is?

Sure, I know what the Gospel is—it is the birth, death, resurrection, and return of Christ. Well, if this is your understanding of the Gospel, welcome to the 85% of fellow Southern Baptist who subscribe to the "half-Gospel, a Gospel Lite." A Gospel that is less spiritually filling and more worldly tasting with no spiritual power to transform lives in to followers of Jesus Christ. The Gospel certainly includes the birth, death, resurrection, and return of Christ, but it is much more than just these "events."

The word Gospel comes from the Greek word "evangel ion" which literally means good news. The Greek word picture is the image of a herald announcing a king's message of good news or joy. Our English words evangelism and evangelist comes from this Greek word. But we need to look "deeper." The English word Gospel is also translated "God's Story."

The Gospel is God's story, His good news about leaving the eternity of His heavenly throne and descending into time to redeem man from the penalty of sin and to reconcile man to

Himself. Listen to what Paul tells us in Roman 5: 8-11, “But God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners Christ died for us. Since we have now been justified by Christ’s blood, how much more shall we be saved from God’s wrath through Him. For if when we were God’s enemies, we were reconciled to Him through the death of His Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through His life. Not only is this so, but also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation. “

However, the Gospel is not just for our redemption and reconciliation; Quoting from the Prophet Isaiah, Christ reminds us in Luke 3:18b that “He has come to set the captives free.” Beloved, those captive include all those who are in the grip of sin’s power in the here and now. This means all those held captive by the sin of addictions, gossip, lying, cheating, debt, and unhealthy life style choices? Sounds like just about all of us. Beloved, “it is for freedom that Christ has set us free” we re no longer enslaved to a life of sin and the penalty for our sin

Dr. R.C. Sproul says, “the Gospel is called good news because it addresses the most serious problem that we all have as human beings, and that is simply this? God is holy and He is just, and we are not. And at the end of our life, we are going to stand before a just and holy God, and we will be judged. We will be judged either on the basis of our own righteousness or lack of it, or based on the righteousness of Jesus Christ. The good news of the Gospel is that Jesus Christ lived a perfect life of righteousness and obedience to God, not for His own well-being, but for sinners. Christ offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice to satisfy the justice and the righteousness of God.” This is what happened at Golgotha. The perfect Lamb of God was slain for us so that our sin would be covered by the righteousness of Christ.

The Wycliffe Bible Encyclopedia summarizes the Gospel this way, “the central truth of the Gospel is that God has provided the way of salvation for men thru the gift of His Son to the world. Jesus suffered as a sacrifice for sin, over-came death, and now offers to share in His triumph all who will accept it. The Gospel is good news because it is a gift of God, not something that must be earned by penance or by self-improvement. Salvation is by God’s grace through faith alone in Christ and His finished work on the Cross and is available to all who put their faith in Christ. This is the essence of John 3:16.

Hence, the Gospel is not a social program to feed hungry or homeless people. The Gospel is not taking care of widows, orphans, or helping those in financial need. All these things are good things, but none of these things are the Gospel. Rather these things are manifestations or outcomes of the Gospel’s power to change hearts and impact lives. Dr. J.D. Greear, in his book [Gospel: Recovering the Power that Made Christianity Revolutionary](#), puts it this way, “You cannot confuse the effects of the Gospel with the Gospel itself.” When we truly understand the Gospel, the love of God will compel us to do good things in the Name of Christ for the glory of God.

Furthermore, the Gospel is not a ticket to for a trouble-free, care-free, and prosperous life. Nowhere does the Bible teach this as any part of the Gospel. When we subscribe to any kind of gospel, other than the real Gospel, the results are tragic. Too many folk today have been disillusioned by a “false gospel” that caters to the consumerism, instant gratification, and ego-centric nature of our culture. These things are the very antithesis of the Gospel and the Crucified life of Christ.

So, let me ask you. Do you know what the Gospel is? How are you living in light of the true Gospel? My prayer is God will open our eyes, our ears, and our hearts to have a passion for the Gospel and sharing the Good News of what God the Father has done for us thru Jesus Christ. May we be a Gospel-centered community of faith! Selah!
