Being Thankful When You Aren't Feeling Thankful

Thanksgiving may require more understanding than we realize. Paul writes in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18, "Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

These are really short verses that seem much easier to say than to do. But the doing of them is critical to our Christian walk. When things are going great, when the economy is good, when our team is winning, when kids are healthy and successful, when our territory is growing, it is easy to be joyful and thankful. But when we are in great distress, when business is slow or the job is lost, when our team is losing, when the children are sick or embarrass or disappoint us; then it becomes easier to pray—but perhaps not so easy to be joyful and give thanks.

The fact is that thanksgiving is a choice. In fact, in many circumstances whether or not to give thanks is the only choice we have. The Bible says that it rains on the just and the unjust alike, that means that sometimes trouble rains on you and me. There is no avoiding the storms of life. We all experience them.

It boils down to our philosophy—our attitude. Chuck Swindoll wrote that our attitude is "the one string that we have to play on." Our attitude is controlled primarily by what we believe about God. Is He sovereign in the universe or not?

My friend Reece Wall, experiencing excruciating illness said, "God is still God." He was acknowledging that God was still in control. And listen to His plan: (Jeremiah 29:11) "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart."

God is sovereign; we aren't sovereign. There is not a single plan that you can make that you can assure will be carried out. That's why James warned against saying, "Tomorrow I shall do this or that" (James 4:13). We know nothing about tomorrow. But God is sovereign over all of his creation—indeed all of the universe. In God, there is no time. In Him is yesterday, today, and forever. He is not carrying out His plan in the future, His plan is now—in the eternal present.

We want to bargain with God today for tomorrow. We ask God to fix it today and we will give Him our tomorrow. And then when our today is fixed, we forget about the bargain we made about our tomorrow. How many of you right now are failing to fulfill promises that you made to God in the past? I dare say there are many in this situation. But God asked you to live in His eternal now, that place where unfulfilled promises are no more; the place where God reigns in your heart, the place where you pray without ceasing, the place where you rejoice always, and the place where you give thanksgiving in all things, knowing simply that it is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. Amen

Why God Wants You to Get in Shape

Don’t you realize that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit, who lives in you and was given to you by God? You do not belong to yourself, for God bought you with a high price. So you must honor God with your body” (1 Corinthians 6:19-20 NLT)

Have you ever heard the word *sanctification*? It’s really just a big theological word that means to dedicate something for God’s purpose. You can sanctify anything. You can say, “God, I sanctify this car, I dedicate it to you for your purposes. God, I sanctify this home. I dedicate it to you for your purposes.

God says in 1 Corinthians 6:19-20 that there’s something he wants you to dedicate to him: your body. “Don’t you realize that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit, who lives in you and was given to you by God? You do not belong to yourself, for God bought you with a high price. So you must honor God with your body” NLT.

How do you do that? How do you honor God with your body?

It’s simple: You take care of it.

“Sanctify your body” basically means “get in shape.” If you want God to use you, you’ve got to get in shape. Because the better shape you are in, the more energy you’ll have and the more God can use you.

Psalms 119:73 says, “You made my body, Lord; now give me sense to heed your laws” (TLB). God set up the principles of good health. He doesn’t just want you to have a pure heart. He wants your body to be in shape so he can use you more effectively.

Maybe you aren’t getting enough sleep. But God can’t use somebody who’s tired all the time. You need to get proper rest. Sometimes the most spiritual thing you can do is to take a nap!

Perhaps you need to work on the food factor. In 1 Corinthians 6:13, the Bible compares overeating to sexual immorality. You might never think of cheating on your spouse, but God says that these are all sins against the body. God is serious about wanting you to control what you eat!

It’s possible you have the wrong attitude toward your body. You neglect it, you reject it (“God, I want a different one!”), or you perfect it (the way a narcissistic body builder worships his body). Instead,

God wants you to respect your body and protect it. Why? Because God created it, Jesus paid for it, and the Holy Spirit lives in it.

So, what’s our motivation to get in shape? The Bible says, “All athletes are disciplined in their training. They do it to win a prize that will fade away, but we do it for an eternal prize (1 Corinthians 9:25 NLT). Our motivation is we want to please God. Athletes get in shape just to win an award. But you will have an eternal reward! You will be rewarded in heaven because you made the most of what you were given, because you took care of your body so that God could use you more effectively here on Earth.

Talk About It

- How does not getting enough sleep affect you during the day? How does it affect your work? Your relationships? Your attitude?
- What one step can you take today to implement healthier eating habits?
- When it comes to physical fitness, some people neglect their bodies and some people worship their bodies. What does a healthy balance look like?
