I would ask him, "How are you, Dad?" He would answer, "All things considered, I'm doing great!" And then he would add, "'All things' includes heaven."

As 2020 is coming to a close, how are you doing? Consider it all: consider the challenges and

disappointments of the year; consider this year's blessings and provisions from God; consider the grief of losing loved ones to old age, to illnesses, to accidents, and to miscarriages; consider the way Jesus is your shepherd even in the valley of the shadow of death; consider losing in-person school, losing sports, losing fellowship

time at work, church, and restaurants; consider with joy how God has blessed some with marriage, children, work, and a congregation to call home.

Take stock of this year. For some it has been unbearably heavy. As your pastor I mourn with you. Your congregation mourns with you. For others the year has had some challenges but overall it has been marked with blessings. As your pastor I rejoice with you. Your congregation rejoices with you.

When you are close to losing heart, if you haven't already, and when your soul is more

downcast than lifted up, consider all things. "All things" includes heaven. In John 16, Jesus compassionately acknowledges the troubles that you face and promises that the sorrow of this world will be turned into joy when He returns. "So also you have sorrow now, but I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you." John 16:22

When the Apostle Paul faced affliction and a "wasting away" feeling, he wrote "So we do not lose

heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. 
unseen are eternal." 2 Corinthians 4:16-18

How do We Christians Go? by Pastor John Lee

As lambs.

Jesus said, "Go your way; behold, I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves." Luke 10:3

We aren't like lean, opportunistic wolves. We don't rely on human resources and man but on God

and the Bible! We go in childlike reliance on Jesus – the Lamb of God who came to give His life freely to rescue us. He came as an available Servant-leader—not as a gentile Lord and benefactor. Our approach is a gentle availability to His callings on our life and a willing example both in life and death.

If you look at the following verses, you will see this Lamb-like sending, expressed as the disciples go without their connections,

money, luggage, or food. They are not going out as beggars, hoping for scraps of mercy thrown to them as we sometimes think—but as sons of peace and amazingly, even declared worthy of their wages and salary—provided for by their heavenly Father. Each

one of us should marvel at the amazing provision that God has given and recognize all that we have as gifts, not entitlements, from God.

It has been wonderful too to see how the Lord richly (and unexpectedly) provides for my wife

Hannah and my girls in Brazil in the dear friends and spiritual family He gives to us and in the shelter and food and clothing and health. We Christians are truly blessed to know the One who can do exceedingly abundantly above all we ask or think.

So let us be so grateful to answer His callings on our lives and keep all He has done before us as we go like lambs.


