Bible Verses for Lesson 2

(NASB)

Bible references for text of lesson:

Acts 2:5-6 "Now there were Jews living in Jerusalem, devout men from every nation under heaven. [5] And when this sound occurred, the crowd came together, and were bewildered because each one of them was hearing them speak in his own language. [6]

Ephesians 5:25-27 "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ has loved the church and gave Himself up for her, [25] so that He might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, [26] that he might present to Himself the church in all her glory, having no spot or wrinkle or any such thing; but that she would be holy and blameless. [27]

Romans 12:6-8 "Since we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, each of us is to exercise them accordingly; if prophecy, according to the proportion of his faith; [6] if service, in his serving; or he who teaches, in his teaching; [7] or he who exhorts, in his exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, cheerfulness. [8]

1 Corinthians 12:7-12 "But to each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. [7] For to one is given the word of wisdom through the Spirit, and to another the word of knowledge according to the same Spirit; [8] to another faith by the same Spirit, and to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, [9] and to another the effecting of miracles, and to another prophecy, and to another the distinguishing of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, and to another the interpretation of tongues. [10] But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually just as He wills; [11] For even as the body is one and yet has many members, and all the members of the body, though they are many, are one body, so also is Christ. [12]

1. **Acts 2:37-38** "Now when they heard this, they were pierced to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, 'Brethren, what shall we do?' [37] Peter said to them, 'Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.'" [38]
Acts 2:41-42 "So then, those who had received his word were baptized' and that day there were added about three thousand souls. [41] They were continually

devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. [42]

Acts 2:47 "praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord was adding to their number day by day those who were being saved."

Acts 4:32 "And the congregation of those who believed were of one heart and soul; and not one of them claimed that anything belonging to him was his own, but all things were common property to them."

Acts 5:14 "And all the more believers in the Lord, multitudes of men and women, were constantly added to their number,"

Acts 2:37-41 "Now when they heard this, they were pierced to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, 'Brethren, what shall we do?' [37] Peter said to them, Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. [38] For the promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off, as many as the Lord our God will call to Himself.' [39] And with many other words he solemnly testified and kept on exhorting them, saying, 'Be saved from this perverse generation!' [40] So then, those who had received his word were baptized; and that day there were added about three thousand souls." [41]

Acts 4:1-4 "As they were speaking to the people, the priests and the captain of the temple guard and Sadducees came up to them, [1] being greatly disturbed because they were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the dead. [2] And they laid hands on them and put them in jail until the next day, for it was already evening. [3] But many of those who had heard the message believed; and the number of the men came to be about five thousand." [4]

Acts 8:4-5, 12 "Therefore, those who had been scattered went about preaching the word. [4] Philip went down to the city of Samaria and began proclaiming Christ to them. [5] . . . But when they believed Philip preaching the good news about the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, they were being baptized, man and women alike. [12]

Acts 10:44-48 "While Peter was still speaking these words. The Holy Spirit fell upon all those who were listening to the message. [44] All of the circumcised believers who came with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit

had been poured out on the Gentiles also. [45] For they were hearing them speaking with tongues and exalting God. Then Peter answered, [46] 'Surely no one can refuse the water for these to be baptized who have received the Holy Spirit just as we did, can he?' [47] And he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked him to stay on for a few days." [48]

Romans 10:17 "So then faith comes from hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ."

Titus 3:5 "He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit."

1 Peter 3:21 "Corresponding to that, baptism now saves you – not the removal of dirt from the flesh, but an appeal to God for a good conscience through the resurrection of Jesus Christ."

Romans 6:3-4 "Or do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death? [3] Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death so that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. [4]

Matthew 26:26-28 "While they were eating, Jesus took some bread and after a blessing, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said, 'Take, eat; this is My body.' [26] And when He had taken a cup and given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, 'Drink from it, all of you; [27] for this is My blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for forgiveness of sins.'" [28]

5. **Romans 12:4-10** "For just as we have many members in one body and all the members do not have the same function, [4] so, we, who are many, are one body in Christ and individually members one of another. [5] Since we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, each of us is to exercise them accordingly; if prophecy, according to the proportion of his faith; [6] if service, in his serving; or he who teaches, in his teaching; [7] or he who exhorts, in his exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, cheerfulness. [8] Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil; cling to what is good. [9] Be devoted to one another in brotherly love; give preference to one another in honor;" [10]

1 Corinthians 12:4-11 "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit, [4] And there are varieties of ministries, and the same Lord. [5] There are varieties of

effects, but the same God who works all things in all persons [6] But to each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. [7] For to one is given the word of wisdom through the Spirit, and to another the word of knowledge according to the same Spirit; [8] to another faith by the same Spirit, and to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, [9] and to another the effecting of miracles, and to another prophecy, and to another the distinguishing of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, and to another the interpretation of tongues. [10] But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually just as He wills; [11]

6. **Romans 14:19** "So then we pursue the things which make for peace and the building up of one another."

Romans 15:1-2 "Now we who are strong ought to bear the weakness of those without strength and not just please ourselves. [1] Each of us is to please his neighbor for his good, to his edification." [2]

Hebrews 12:14-15 "Pursue peace with all men, and the sanctification without which no one will see the Lord. [14] See to it that no one comes short of the grace of God; that no root of bitterness springing up causes trouble, and by it many be defiled;" [15]

2 Peter 3:17-18 "You therefore, beloved, knowing this beforehand, be on your guard so that you are not carried away by the error of unprincipled men and fall from your own steadfastness, [17] but grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be the glory, both now and the day of eternity. Amen. [18]

7. **Genesis 12:3** "And I will bless those who bless you, And the one who curses you I will curse. And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed."

1 Timothy 2:4 "Who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth."

Matthew 28:19 "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit,"

Acts 5:27-29 "When they had brought them, they stood them before the Council. The high priest questioned them, [27] saying, 'We gave you strict orders not to continue teaching in this name, and yet, you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and intend to bring this man's blood upon us.' [28] But Peter and the apostles answered, 'We must obey God rather than men.'" [29]

Acts 8:1-4 "Saul was in hearty agreement with putting him to death. And on that day a great persecution began against the church in Jerusalem, and they were all scattered throughout the regions of Judea and Samaria, except the apostles. [1] Some devout men buried Stephen, and made loud lamentation over him. [2] But Saul began ravaging the church, entering house after house and dragging off men and women, he would put them in prison. [3] Therefore, those who had scattered went about preaching the word. [4]

Acts 9:18-20 “And immediately there fell from his eyes something like scales, and he regained his sight, and he got up and was baptized; [18] and he took food and was strengthened. Now for several days he was with the disciples who were at Damascus, [19] and immediately he began to proclaim Jesus in the synagogues, saying, ‘He is the Son of God.’” {20]

Acts 13:1-5 “Now there were at Antioch, in the church that was there, prophets and teachers: Barnabas, and Simeon who was called Niger, and Lucius of Cyrene, and Manaen who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch, and Saul. [1] While they were ministering to the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, ‘Set apart for Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.’ [2] Then, when they had fasted and prayed and laid their hands on them, they sent them away. [3] So, being sent out by the Holy Spirit, they went down to Seleucia and from there they sailed to Cyprus.” [4]

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
