Eliot, American born, only to renounce his citizenship to become a British poet and playwright, once wrote a sensible line for us to consider: "Beware of dreaming of systems so perfect that no one has to be good." Instead of "systems" you should allow your mind to say, "presidents" or "political parties" or "churches" or "laws" so perfect—"that no one has to be good."



There has never been a politician or political system so perfect that (he/she or it) absolves us of the difficult responsibilities of personal, daily integrity and responsible citizenship. One should not place this unrealistic hope upon any human system. It is limited to the Holy One. The morality and hope of our nation depends on our individual and collective moral pursuit. Backing one corrupt and boorish individual over another corrupt and boorish individual brings ultimate division upon a country founded on Liberty and Justice for all. The spirit and commitment of citizens raise and/or lower the moral level of a nation or a church. Look to any long-involved politician to find that crookedness among them reflects the crookedness of our systems.

I know we are all ready to get past the obnoxiousness plaguing us for the past nine months and get into some semblance of normalcy with our routines, including in our Christian walk. As Christians, Christ is the center of our lives, the starting point of seeing the world and interacting with other people. He encourages us to live the personal traits of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, faithfulness, and goodness. You might wonder if Christ can really use you... Adrian Rogers, a prominent preacher and religious leader, gives a beautiful example in Moses and the burning bush. God told Moses to take off his shoes because he was standing on Holy ground. Moses took off his shoes, but as Moses looked at the burning bush, he was awe-struck that the fire did not consume it. Moses' thoughts were, "Wow, look at how that bush just keeps burning for God. I wish I could be like that bush and just keep burning for God." Using our imaginations, God might be saying something like, "Moses, you think this bush is wonderful? I could do the same with this bush and with that bush. Any old bush will do." We see a servant of God and think, "look what he is doing for God!" God says, "it is not what he is doing, but what I am doing in him. Any old bush will do. You will do, if you will allow me to be me in you. You will be me, if you will let me in you." So, any old bush will do. You will do if you will let God in you, be God. Galatians 2:20 tells us, "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me."

We are Disciples of Christ. As we move toward Thanksgiving, Christmas, and a new year, I challenge you to practice the disciplines of daily discipleship. Make prayer, Bible study, fellowship with Christians, and witnessing part of your daily routine to make Jesus Christ evermore the center of your life. And let God in you, be God. And God will bless you, increase your faith, and use you for God's glorious and eternal purposes!
