- 3. The church provides a moral and ethical compass in the midst of relativism. Like a swamp of murky, slimy water, our society has either rethought or resisted, or completely rejected any absolutes. Not the church! It still stands on the timeless bedrock of Scripture and truth.
- 4. The church is the only place I know to find true community, healing, compassion, and love. It is here that people care. Really care. Not because of status or money. But because the Spirit of God is at work, weaving together the lives within the Body.
- 5. The church (like no other institution) has provided motivation for the most lasting, unselfish, essential, courageous ministries on earth. Schools. Hospitals. Halfway houses. Orphanages. Leprosariums. Missions.

Now, the church is not perfect (you are a part of it aren't you?) and it has not always modeled its message. But whatever is next in order to its importance in world history is a distant second—way down the line. Most of all, not on Kesler's list, is the fact that Jesus Christ Himself claims ruler ship as the head. Born and raised in Puerto Rico, USA, my "Holy Week" experience was probably a little bit different from your own experience. To begin with it was our school Spring Break. "Holy Week" was our precious time off from school and a great time to just relax and do nothing. Literally, for many, "do nothing".

The observance of Holy week demanded a very strict quiet meditation. It marked the end of lent, a time when many Puerto Ricans did penance by mortifying their flesh, repentance of sins, almsgiving, and denial of ego. It was common to see people walking along side of the road wearing purple or black robes and carrying a cross from one town to the next. In my mind, the biggest the cross the worst was the sin. I remember seeing people walking on their knees as penance.

As a child I was not allowed to play outside with my cousins during the entire lent season. Playing baseball was like hitting Jesus with a bat, or jumping rope was like giving lashes to Jesus. Mom's will make us feel ashamed to play any games during lent. Instead, we'll go to mass often and every day during "Holy Week". On "Holy Friday" we all joined the "Holy Week Procession". A statue of Jesus in a glass coffin will be carried on the shoulders of a dozen men through the main streets of town follow by hundreds of people singing solemn hymns and praying the rosary. There were other statues of Mary and Joseph and lots of people wearing their robes and carrying their crosses. It was like a contest of who carried the largest and/or heaviest cross.

All that came to an end on Easter Sunday. People will wear white robes and white cloths. A beautiful mass with joyful music was followed with great celebrations at the park in front of the church where candies, cookies and punch were served. Finally, I could go and play and celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ! I love Easter!!!!

Easter Sunday represents an opportunity for each of us to reflect on our relationship with a loving Creator and a wonderful Savior. It is a time for us to apply eternal perspective to the daily matters athand and to contemplate our fate beyond these years on earth. I hope that you will come and celebrate with us on April 21st as we seek to honor God Almighty for His steadfast faithfulness and sacrifice.

During the season of Lent, the church spends time preparing for Jesus' death on Good Friday. A time where we are reflecting on our own immortality and what might take us away from the One who Created us. For kids and youth in our church, Lent is a time where they are invited to think about and discern their own Discipleship and membership in our church. This year, it is a great, wonderful joy to share that we have five considering joining the church by baptism. It will be up to them in the end to elect if they are ready to make that important and one-time decision.

It is an honor for me to facilitate a class where as a group, they learn about different aspects of Christianity and the Church. This week the Discipleship class learned about the term contrition. According to Rev. Christopher Wilson, the writer of Passage into Discipleship: Guide to Baptism, sin is when we move away from God and contribution is the lifelong journey of when we move back towards God. On Sunday afternoon, I drew a diagram on the whiteboard, where sin was an arrow pointing away from God and then I explained that contrition was an arrow pointing us back to God. I promise, all at once, every person in the room together took a deep breath and said, "Ohhhh, I get it now." They understood what contrition, forgiveness, and repentance really meant.

As people in our community of faith are walking on this journey with God towards baptism, you too are invited to walk on this journey with them. Not only to support and pray for them, but to provide the experience to you again. Anytime you witness a baptism, you are reminded of your own. So, during this last few weeks leading up to Easter, I ask for you to pray for those beginning their journey to baptism as well as those being reminded of their own (including yourself).

In the same way of being reminded of your own walk with Christ to baptism, I invite you to think of one of those times that you had an "Ohhhh, I get it now" moments. A time where, you said "Aha!" Maybe you can even call it an eureka effect of your faith. In scripture, we get a lot of those "Eureka!" moments: Saul on the road to Damascus, Mary accepting the news of Jesus to be born from Gabriel, and even Jesus changing his mind by the words of the women at the well.

The more I think about it, the more I believe that "Aha" moment is, in fact, getting you closer to God, and therefore a moment of experiencing contrition. Maybe it's a figurative apple hitting you on the head, but it's a time where you have been discerning with God, and your relationship with the Divine is stronger. I pray that you have a moment where you can better understand the fullness of the presence of our Creator. May we be that supportive community of all who seek to learn, grow, and serve the Most Holy. During this time of Lent, let us be open to the discernment of God, no matter where we are on our journey with Christ whether we are simply beginning it or getting back on track.
