Or are you holidayed out yet? If you are, that's okay. At this point, the season of advent has come to its annual culmination. The twelve days of Christmas, including Epiphany and the New Year are behind us. So now, we can all just relax for a bit, and take a deep breath, before preparing ourselves for lent and the triduum. Which is just the fancy word for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sun

One of the blessed truths that we as Christians live with, is recognizing that we don't always need to sustain the highs of this life. The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod LCMS Stewardship Ministry Newsletter Article – January 2020

Our God is a God who works through means. He can and has worked immediately without agency, as the Bible testifies, but primarily, on the whole and for the most part, our God works through means. He does this not only for all of our earthly needs but also for all of our spiritual needs. And He does this for our benefit.

He provides for all our needs of this body and life through means. He gives us fathers and mothers to care for us when we are young. Through them, God provides house and home, food and clothing, education and training in the arts and work of this world.

He gives us good government to protect us from harm and danger; He gives us faithful neighbors and good friends to help in times of need and lack. He gives us employers who trade our work for income so that we may acquire the needs of the body. He gives us brains and brawn so that we will have something to trade with those employers for that needed income. This work, which we are able to do only because of what God has provided to us, redounds to the benefit of others. And so, the cycle of God giving through means continues.

He provides for all our needs of our souls. He sent His Son into the flesh to be our Savior. In that body, our Lord Jesus Christ lived the life that God demands of us all - a life we have failed to live because of our sins - and, in that body, He made payment for those sins on the cross, once and for all.

God delivers this forgiveness through the means of His Word and Sacraments. He calls pastors to proclaim, in His stead and by His command, that our sins are forgiven for Jesus' sake. Through these same pastors, God Himself claims us as His own in Holy Baptism, placing His own name on us in water and Word, igniting faith by the gift of the Holy Spirit. And He gives us His life-giving body and blood to nourish us in this same faith until the end. Our God is a God who works through means.

This is true also of stewardship. This is what St. Paul wrote in Philippians:

"I have received full payment, and more. I am well supplied, having received from Epaphroditus the gifts you sent, a fragrant offering, a sacrifice acceptable and pleasing to God. And my God will supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 4:18–19).

The gift St. Paul received from the Philippian church is a fragrant offering, a sacrifice acceptable and pleasing to God. They gave to God. God provided for St. Paul through the Philippians. And the God who loves both Paul and the Philippians will supply their every need according to the riches in Christ Jesus. Our God is a God who works through means.

"For all the promises of God find their Yes in [Jesus Christ]," St. Paul tells us in 2 Cor. 1:20. This is true also of you. Trust in the God who provides for all that we need in body and soul through means. And not only will you find His "yes" to you, but others will find it, too, through you. "But as you excel in everything – in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in all earnestness, and in our love for you – see that you excel in this act of grace also" (2 Cor. 8:7).



- 1. The New Envelopes are **NOT DATED OR NUMBERED**, as in the past, which envelope can be used. means every
- 2. Last year we experimented with a few boxes of **NUMBERED BUT NOT DATED** envelopes for members usually giving monthly. This seemed to be successful. Those members have a number 41 AND LARGER printed on their envelopes and should continue to use all in their box.

Members that normally use a weekly envelope (numbered with a number LESS THAN 40) or are new to Bethlehem have a set of 52 envelopes in their church mailbox. A number has been given to each set.

If you do not wish to use the envelopes, please place them in the Financial Secretary large mailbox on the right-hand side of the mailboxes so they can be saved for in the future.

Also, for convenience and visitors, a few envelopes have been placed in the plastic holders in the pews and at the back of the church. Let's be good stewards and not use them for scratch paper. Thanks.

Howdy from Elk County!

Well it is hard to believe it has been a little over a year since I abruptly relocated. I am happy to say that Mom is doing well, other than an ear infection she picked up while we were living in a camper, while her old mobile home was being moved out of the way for her new one. I moved her into her room on the 26th. I am still in the camper and plan to be in it for some time as I want to get all Mom's stuff in the new house before I drag my stuff into my new room. It is very odd moving into a brand new home as I have always lived in older houses and bunkhouses.

My border collie dogs are adjusting to living in the camper with me. I am down to four from the six I had earlier this year and those of you who had met my old freckled faced dog that smiles, I want you to know that I had to put her down in September due to health issues and she was 13. Mom had an old dog that we had to put down as well and two weeks after that, a short haired collie showed up. He is about 5 yeas old and won't leave Mom's side. We finally received a letter from my youngest brother, Gerald, who we have not heard from in over 3 years. He just found out about the accident and said he would come home as soon as he could and was able. He has been out of country for about 8 years now.

Ashton and her husband George moved from Milwaukee Wisconsin to Houston Texas, the first of December. Ashton has taken a job with a NASA contractor and will be working part of the time at the Johnson Space center on a type of rover for the moon. She is very excited as she has always wanted to work for NASA in hopes of becoming an astronaut. George is still working on his Phd in Sociology and will have to put the last two semesters on hold as he is an officer in the army reserves and his unit has been called to active duty starting January 1st. They will train for six months and then deploy to Afghanistan sometime in July of 2020. Please keep George in your prayers as he is in command of an artillery unit and will probably be in the middle of things. So Ashton and George will only have a month together in their new apartment before George is off to the army.

I am pretty busy down here. After I get the rest of Mom's things moved into the new mobile home, I have to start putting up new fence on the property and cutting down trees that are in the existing fence. I don't get bored. Maybe, if my brother Gerald comes home to stay, that will give me some time to come up to Sylvan Grove for a week or so visit.


