Oh Say, Can You Hear

In this election year, presidential candidates are yelling at each other, calling names, and working hard to be *heard*. They want voters to *hear* them and respond by coming out to vote. But what we *hear* is often determined by what we already know, or think we know. Sometimes we hear things that may not make sense at first.

If you are in Pennsylvania Dutch country, you might hear a man say to his son, "Go throw the cow over the fence some hay." Or in the Southeastern United States, you may hear someone tell you that tomorrow they have to "carry momma to the doctor", or you may be asked to "get the hose pipe" (a Garden Hose in the rest of the world). Sometimes the things we *hear* don't quite mean what they sound like.

Jesus uses examples of sheep and shepherd. He refers to *calling His sheep and they come out and follow Him.* This makes more sense when we realize that, long before barbed wire, herds of sheep grazed together, although they did not all belong to the same shepherd. A group of shepherds could gather their herds together and share the task of protecting all of the sheep during the night. When morning came, if the shepherds needed to travel on separately, each shepherd would make a sound (compare it to hog calling), and the sheep that belong to each shepherd would come out of the group and follow only their own shepherd. The sheep will actually separate themselves from the others.

I knew a sheep rancher many years ago. She was a combination of Annie Oakley and Calamity Jane with the volume turned-up ten times and the vocabulary of a career sailor. When I would drive up to the ranch, the sheep would all run away from the fence. When my rancher friend would come out and make her unique call (a shriek with a twist that cannot be imitated) the sheep all came over to the fence ... they knew her voice, *heard* her, and responded.

How do the sheep learn the voice of their shepherd? When this sheep rancher started her herd of about 100, she kept the young lambs in a small corral. Every time she would give them food or water or do anything for them, she would make her unique noise. After a short while, the young sheep learned the voice of their shepherd and responded. From that point on, they would not come to any other call.

How do we *hear* the voice of the Lord, the Good Shepherd? Remember the old AM/FM Radios? The tuning knob often had another tuning ring behind it for *fine tuning*. That was how you kept your station tuned-in as

clear as possible. To keep our spiritual hearing tuned-in to the voice of the Lord, there are three things we can do:

- 1. **Study**. Intentional, regular Bible Study using Daily Devotions and other guides to growing in faith. Get involved in a study program and habit that feeds a healthy, growing faith (perhaps the *Bishop's Bible Challenge*).
- 2. **Prayer**. Make time for daily prayer. Sometimes we just don't have the words to say, or don't know where to begin praying. One excellent resource for prayer is the *Book of Common Prayer*. BCP Pages 137-140 contain short personal devotions for Morning, Noon, Evening and Bedtime prayers. You can use your smart phone to set alarms reminding you to take a few minutes to pray during each day. By the way, you are actually allowed to have a BCP in your home, and they make pocket-sized ones as well ... I'm just saying.
- 3. **Practice**. Listening for the voice of the Shepherd requires practice. Our Shepherd Jesus is on-the-move, and the Church is called to be on-the-move as well. We are the Church, the body of Christ in the world today. Through study and prayer we can fine-tune our *hearing* and respond to the call to be the body of Christ. We can offer a kind word, a prayer of support or sympathy, a heartfelt "you're doing a great job!", or an honest "I love you".

One of the most important factors in *hearing* the Lord is turning-off the noise. Study and prayer work better without the TV on, or the cell phone in your hand. Take some time to tune-out from the busy, noisy world, and remember how much God loves you and wants the best for you. The Shepherd will not hurt you or abandon you. "My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand." (John 10:27-28, NRSV)

"O God, whose Son Jesus is the good shepherd of your people: Grant that when we hear his voice we may know him who calls us each by name, and follow where he leads; who, with you and the Holy Spirit, lives and reigns, one God for ever and ever. *Amen*." (BCP 1979, p. 225)


