Dear Friends at St Clement's,

Whew! What a summer we had! "Mass on the Grass" was a lot of fun – and required flexibility! And our sanctuary renovation went well, and is nearly complete, down to the finishing touches! We've had some challenges with new technology, but overall what I'm hearing is that folks are very pleased with the results, the fresh walls, new lighting, and a church that, well, "looks more like a real church" as one said. Thanks to all who helped and made this possible. And this month, well, we're not stopping, hardly taking a breath! TWO new efforts, one short term and one hopefully longer term, are coming our way.

The FIRST is an outgrowth of the Adult Education Survey that many of you filled out back in April, asking about the subjects you'd be interested in studying during a time between the two services – one that would generate enough interest that the 8 o'clockers would want to stay, and the 10 o'clockers would be willing to come a little early (like around 9.30) to participate in. We'll start by watching and then discussing some short videos (TED talks) addressing current issues and exploring a Christian perspective to these issues. In October, I'll be leading a course based on the book "Jesus Interrupted" by Bart Ehrman – basically an "introduction to the New Testament" book.

The SECOND is the photo sessions for a new pictorial Directory for the parish. I've been told we haven't had one for several years, and as we grow and develop new ministries, it's helpful to see who's who and who's doing what. Photo sessions for the new directory are scheduled for Friday and Saturday, 9/25-26, and Saturday, 10/10. You can either sign up after church, or use the link on our website and sign up online. And feel free to invite your family members to join you, and use this as an opportunity to create family photo Holiday cards for Thanksgiving or Christmas for this year! We'll also be asking for help on the day of the photo sessions – we'll need "hosts" to check folks in and collect their info (so everyone's name is spelled correctly!) in addition to help signing folks up on Sundays. ## Don't Forget the Crop Walk

Did you know that malnutrition is an underlying cause of death for 3.5 million children each year? That's about one-third of all child deaths in the world. Upper arm circumference is one measurement of malnutrition. An average 5-year old's upper arm is about 7 inches around. A severely malnourished child's upper arm would be less than 3 inches around. Factors contributing to this malnutrition are many – drought and disasters that decimate crops, lack of clean water, poor sanitation and hygiene, and rising food prices, to name a few. But we can help save lives – and give children a chance to grow healthy and strong! When we walk in the CROP Hunger Walk, we're providing micronutrients that support better health and development. Helping communities gain access to safe water. And giving families the tools and training to grow or buy nutritious food. We hope you'll help raise funds and walk with us on October 11 so we can wipe out malnutrition for good!

BOUTIFUL GOD, help us to see the world differently – not with our own limited vision but with the gaze of love and justice. Give us the foolishness to believe that we can change what the world says is impossible: and when we lose sight of the power of love to change the world, increase our faith. Amen.
