Pastor's Message:

When you have eaten your fill and built houses and live in them... Do not say to yourself, "My power and the might of my hand have gotten me this wealth." But remember the Lord your God, for it is God that gives you the power to get wealth, so that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your ancestors, as he is doing today.

(Deuteronomy 8: 12, 17-18)

We are in the season of Lent. It began on Ash Wednesday, February 26th this year, and will continue until Easter on April 12th. Lent is a time of preparation for Easter. Our personal preparation is traditionally a time of introspection, self-examination and repentance. We can think of it as taking a look at our lives, assessing where we are going and where we ought to be going, and correcting course as necessary.

It is a good time to consider our Christian stewardship. *Stewardship* is a term that often gets reduced to "how we handle money," and "how much we give to the church." It is that, in part, but it is much more. John Wesley, in his sermon "The Good Steward," points out that a steward is a person who is entrusted with what belongs to another. The steward is not free to use the property in whatever way they choose, but only in accordance with the will of the owner. It has been said that "*stewardship is everything you do after you say 'yes' to Jesus.*"* When we say "yes" to Jesus, we begin to recognize that everything that exists is from God, and belongs to God. *Christian stewardship* acknowledges that we are stewards of what belongs to God.

God entrusts to us our selves (body [actions], mind [thoughts], and soul [intentions]), our talents, our relationships, our time, our environment, and our resources. We are capable of using these in any way that we choose; many people choose to use them in entirely self-serving ways. As Christians, however, we have said "yes" to God as revealed in Jesus Christ, and therefore we acknowledge that we are accountable to God for how we handle them. Since they belong to God, we ought to strive to use them as God intends. What that means, in particular, to each of us is a matter that each of us needs to learn. We do that through prayer, through the study of the scriptures, through listening to teachers who have prayed and studied, and through conversation with others who are seeking to learn God's will for their lives.

We are accountable to God for our stewardship of what God entrusts to us. That means that we ought to be striving to be able to look God in the eye and say, "I am taking good care of myself and my family; I am loving your people as you love them; I am caring for your world; I am using my talents and my resources in every way that I can to please you, glorify you, and serve you."

I am thankful for God's grace, because I can seldom say that I am doing all that I can. And even when I am doing all that I can, it is not all that I want to do in response to the great love that God has shown to me. Let this time of Lent be a time for all of us to consider:

How am I caring for myself and my loved ones?

Am I loving God and other people as God has loved me?

Am I using the abilities, money, and time that God has entrusted to me

in ways that I would be proud to discuss with God?

How can I do more to respond to God's love?





Thoughts from Lisa Kostyshak

Ideas of what to Give Up or Add or Do for Lent.

1- Don't buy anything that you don't NEED.

If you can live without it, you don't need it. Give it up for Lent. Put the money that you would have spent into a jar. After the 40 days, put some into savings and donate the rest.

2- Throw Away 40 things for 40 days

Every day walk around your house and collect 40 things to donate or throw away... every day, until Lent ends. Try donating, because you are helping others.

3- No Gossiping.

Give up gossiping for Lent. That means you cannot do any gossiping. None! If someone says something negative about another person, either say something nice or don't say anything at all. You would think this is going to be SO easy, but when you can't say anything negative about anyone else, you realize how often it happens, sadly.

4- No eating after dinner

It might really make you think about Lent because you can see just a glimpse of how Jesus struggled when he was hungry.

5. Say 3 nice things to your spouse & kids daily.

You may think this is easy, but try to say things that aren't the normal "Thanks" or "You look nice." or "Good job." Try to do 3 out-of-the-box things during Lent this year "I love how you always help the kids." or "I love how you work hard on your homework, even when it is tough tonight. You are a hard worker"

6- Don't eat out for 40 days.

Prep meals ahead of time. Try to make easy crockpot meals.

7- Replace 30 minutes of TV time with 30 extra minutes of devotion/prayer time.

Read a devotional or bible story with your family and have a discussion about it. Even young kids can get involved in this.

8- Do not complain.

We often complain and whine about things, but we need to try to have a positive outlook on things. You don't realize how much you complain until you give it up... "Do everything without arguing or complaining..." Philippians 2:14 NIV





GUMC Congregational Meeting on Aldersgate Hispanic United Methodist – January 25,2020

- We had a Town Hall meeting attended by approximately 40 people about the possibility Aldersgate
 Hispanic UM relocating their congregation here at GUMC. The purpose was to let the congregation know
 we were approached, and should we continue to work on this potential commitment.
- Currently the church is supported by Aldersgate, with the pastor splitting his time between Leroy and Aldersgate.
- They have one member in each of the committees SPRC, Finance, Church Council
- They have their own financial secretary
- They also apply for grants through the conference to help support their ministries.
- Handouts were given to the attendees on New Faith Community Planters, from the conference, outlining best practices for partnership, building utilization, and finance.
- A vote was taken to continue into looking further into partnership. The majority of attendees voted yes to continue.

• The next steps:

Pastor Matt and a select group will meet with Aldersgate to understand how they handled the finance even though it will be a completely different arrangement at GUMC. They will also find out why they are no longer supporting the Hispanic congregation and what were some of the issues they had with sharing the building.

There will need to be another meeting set up with the Hispanic church to understand their reasons for not working with Aldersgate anymore, the problems they had with sharing a facility, what are their expectations from us, and if they support our efforts for being a Reconciling church.

We will set up another meeting for the congregation with the answers from the above meetings. Also, Pastor Matt will try to get the DS and someone from New Faith Planters division to attend the next congregation meeting.
