Message from our Pastor:

...So Sow

(see the Parable of the Sower - Matthew 13: 3-23)

Spring is the time when I start thinking "Garden!" Since I moved into our present home in July of 2011, I have enjoyed the plantings of the people who have lived in the house in years past, and I have done some planting of my own. In the spring, I love to watch the bulb flowers push up their shoots and flowers, and the perennial flowers and bushes putting out shoots from dormant roots and twigs. Pretty soon, it will be time to think about planting annuals and a vegetable patch.

As I read the Parable of the sower, I think back on the various garden patches that I have had at parsonages over the years. At one house, the only place for a vegetable garden was behind the garage, an area that had been used as a dumping ground over the years – not for garbage, exactly, but for rocks, and branches, logs, fireplace ashes, old lumber, and other stuff of that sort. All this stuff was then overgrown with weeds. Had I done as the sower did in the parable – random scattering of seed – I might have gotten a few plants that grew to maturity, but not many. Instead, I spent some time and energy clearing out rocks and stuff, killing off and beating back weeds, and tilling the soil. In fact, it took the whole first summer we were there to get the ground ready so that I could plant the next year. After all the work, the next year I had a nice garden.

As Jesus explained the parable to his disciples, the seed is the Gospel or "Good News", the soils are the people who hear the Good News, and the sower represents those who want to spread the Good News of God's love, forgiveness, and promise of abundant life through Jesus Christ. If our lives and words are in keeping with the Gospel, then we are sowing seeds all the time. A lot of it falls on deaf ears and skeptical or cynical minds. Once in a while, the Gospel gets through to someone through our words and/or actions. Percentage-wise, that portion is small.

However, we have a chance, in small areas close to our daily lives, to cultivate a small garden for the Gospel. We don't have to accept that the people close to us are too rock-strewn, or hard-packed, or weed-infested for the Gospel to take root and grow. With these people, as in our small household garden, we can take some time to "prepare the soil." We can help clear away some of the obstacles to belief and growth – the "rocks and weeds" of care, worries, and burdens. We can water, condition, and fertilize the soil with love, forgiveness, and

generosity. We can live as though God loves, forgives, and promises life to <u>us</u>, as an example to them. Then we can carefully plant the seeds, and care for them. We can't do this for the whole world, but we can do it in small patches close to home.

All of us who believe have seed to be scattered, through the words we say and the things we so. We can plant the seed and hope it grows, and in a few lives, we can care for it and help it along. So sow!

MAY IS FINALLY HERE! YIPPEE! NEW LIFE IS HERE AMONGST US! PENTECOST IS COMING! SOON!! THE END OF MAY... MAY 19TH...

We often consider Pentecost is the birthday of the church. Without the coming of the Holy Spirit that came at Pentecost, there would not be a church. It was the Holy Spirit that ignited the flame of evangelism that spread the message throughout the world.

In the subtropical country of Israel, there was an early harvest. The Hebrew celebration of Pentecost was all about the harvest. During Jesus' day, the festival was no longer about the Harvest but about celebrating the Torah (the law) on Mt Sinai. The word Pentecost is from Greek for 50 days.

At this festival which occurred 50 days after Jesus' resurrection, people came from many directions, from many countries, cultures and languages. In the midst of this chaos the Holy Spirit came to the early disciples who did not know what to do next with Jesus gone.

For any years, Pentecost has become a day of receiving of new converts to the church community. This year Pentecost, the birthday of the church is on May 19th. Often people become members of the church on this special Sunday. This year, the confirmation class will join on June 9th due to being busy on the 19th.

The Color for Pentecost is RED representing the flame of the Holy Spirit. (The flame is on the United Methodist Symbol of Cross and flame. Imagine if we all wore it.

The symbols for Pentecost are the DOVE, FLAME, RAINBOW, WIND

Finance Report:

Fourteen weeks into 2013, we find a shortfall with the In/Out budget Vs. Actual to be \$1,735,02. This is down from the previous week (13) by around \$6,000.00. This drop in the shortfall was due to a tremendous collection on week 14.

We continue to fall short with the Budget Gap program that was set up in the 2013 budget. We need \$269.23 per week to meet the \$14,000 budget amount. We are close to \$2,000 behind schedule. We need to keep plugging away at this attempt to meet the 2013 budget.

Pledged income is coming in ahead of schedule by \$4,000 and Un-pledged is ahead by \$600.00.
