# Pastor's Message:

"All the shine of a thousand spotlights, all the stars we steal from the night sky will never be enough."

As we roll into the month of September, we look forward to Autumn and the start of new things. I find it interesting that, as much as we are resistant to change, when we expect change to come, we get excited about it. Consider the seasons. Most people look forward to the seasons, maybe not the cold weather, but certainly the possibilities to engage in new activities and to experience new and familiar things.

When Winter turns to Spring, I look forward to seeing the leaves on the trees and hearing the songs of birds that were absent for a season. As Spring turns to Summer, I look forward to vacations and the feel of grass or warm sand on my bare feet. As Summer turns to Fall, I look forward to seeing the beauty of nature on display through the change of colors in the leaves. And as Fall turns to Winter, I look forward to the beauty and quiet of that first snowfall. These are changes I look forward to and get excited about.

I love all things music, and a song from the musical, *The Greatest Showman*, comes to mind. The song is entitled *Never Enough*. The entire show is about living into a dream – making that dream a reality. What are our God-sized dreams? What are our expectations? Are the expectations we have for ourselves and others around us inspirational? I believe that God has begun a good work in us, and that God will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. With that belief comes the responsibility to strive for that goal – to dream God-sized dreams and to move into this new season stepping out in faith.

The season is changing. The change is familiar and exciting. What are you looking forward to doing and experiencing? What new God-sized dream might come with the change of the season? Let's dream together and make those dreams our expectations as we strive to live into all that God has created us to be.






