Message from the Pastor:

I feel as though I am behind the times. Back in March of this year, a group of people who have been involved in various disaster response projects were invited to form a team to work under FEMA's efforts in Saipan, a US territory in the Northern Marianas Islands (the same archipelago as Guam) near the Philippines. Saipan was devastated by Super Typhoon Soudelor in August of 2015. I, and six others from western NY including my wife Cathy, will be in Saipan for three weeks (from October 27 to November 18, 2017) to participate in the ongoing rebuilding of houses and community buildings. Teams are asked to commit to three weeks for this project because of the cost of transporting people to the southwestern Pacific.

I say I feel behind the times, because so many disasters have happened since I agreed to go to Saipan. United Methodist Volunteer in Mission (VIM) teams are forming and deploying to Texas, Louisiana, Georgia, and Florida, and soon (we hope) to the US territories of Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands. Our attention has shifted to these more recent storms, but it takes years to clean up and rebuild following a large hurricane. I worked on rebuilding teams in Biloxi, Mississippi as late as 2010 following the damage of Hurricane Katrina (2005).

Disaster response takes place in three stages: The first is "Rescue," getting people out of harm's way and helping them through the storm. Cathy participated in "rescue" when she went to work in a shelter in Texas following Hurricane Harvey this September. The second stage is "Early Response", in which trees are cleared, basements mucked out, roofs tarped, and wet furnishings, wallboard, and insulation removed from houses. This takes place in the days, weeks, and sometimes months immediately following the storm. The third stage is "Recovery." Recovery is the rebuilding of structures and communities and lives. This can take many years. I was pastor in Corning, NY in 2010, and people still talked about the 1972 flood as though it happened last week.

I feel blessed to be a part of this effort. I understand it as living the Gospel and being God's love to our neighbors, even though we will be there under the auspices of the US government. Please pray for me and Cathy and our team as we are in mission later this month.




Managing: We take good care of what we have received. We manage these resources wisely — for our own good and the good of others.



Message from Outreach:

November offers so many opportunities for giving thanks and for giving to others.



First, between now and November 12, we can fill up plastic shoeboxes with a variety of items as part of the **Red Bird Mission** based in the Appalachian Mountains of Kentucky, providing ministries to rural residents distressed by chronic poverty, lack of jobs, and poor housing. Outreach will provide the plastic shoeboxes which can be filled with the following items for adults or children and returned to the commons area by Sunday, November 12:

• Items for the adults' shoe boxes (<u>Please mark for a man or woman</u>)

Include: comb/brush, shampoo, hand lotion, deodorant, toothbrush and paste, chap stick, full-size bath soap, wash cloth, mittens, disposable razors, shaving cream, scarves and hats, nail care supplies, socks, and work gloves.

Items for the children's shoe boxes (Please mark for a boy or girl, and the age category: 2-4, 5-9, and 10-14)

Include two or three toy items, two or three school items, bar soap, children's toothbrush. children's toothpaste, shampoo, lotion, wash cloth, comb/brush, chapstick, mittens, hats, socks, and small flashlights. Christian bookmarks, wrist bands, and other spiritual items are also appreciated.

Please do not wrap the boxes. Please include \$1 for each shoebox in a separate envelope to help with shipping costs.



Creating Stories

"This is what I believe," he said.



"I believe that I am called to live in good relationship with all that is around me. I believe that I am in good relationship with the Creator. I believe that I am in good relationship with those who are my brothers and sisters, all those who are human. I believe that I am in good relationship with all the Two-Leggeds, Four-Leggeds, Those that Fly in the Air, Those that Swim, and Those that Crawl Upon the Earth. 
