Pastor's Message:

Ogive thanks to the Lord, for God is good; For God's steadfast love endures forever! (Psalms 106, 107, 118, 136)

November is the month of the *holiday* of Thanksgiving. But let's not limit our giving thanks to one single day. Let it be a month of giving thanks to God. Let it be the beginning (or the restart) of a lifetime of giving thanks to God - an attitude of gratitude, each and every day.



#### **Greece United Methodist COVID In-person Guidelines**

Requirements: Facial Masks, Screening, Temperatures, Social Distancing

Available: Masks, Hand Sanitizer, Cleansing Wipes

Not Available: Sunday School, Children's Church, Nursery, Bulletins, Pew Bibles, Hymnals, Guest

Sign-in Books, Offering plates,

#### **Process:**

• Limited access into the building – Only use of the main entrance located off the parking lot (Kings Common)

- Doors will be opened (weather permitted) 30 mins before the service and kept open.
- Screening table will be at the entrance of the building. You must stop at a screening table before entering the building.
- You will be asked a series of pre-screening questions, your temperature will be taken (100.3 or below accepted), and sign-in attendance (for contact tracing) will be taken before entering the building.
- We will be counting attendees to make sure we do not exceed capacity requirements.
- Name tags will be available on outside table. Congregation will take their name tags with them after the service and will be responsible for the care of them. It is recommended that you wear you name tag when possible. It is difficult to recognize people with their masks on. (Suggestion: Leave in your vehicle so you have it each week.)
- After screening, proceed directly to the sanctuary where an usher will seat you/family in a social distance approved pew.
- Tithing box will be inside sanctuary doors.
- At the end of the service, ushers will release congregation one pew at a time. Please proceed directly to parking lot.
- Non-touch socializing should be before and after the service, **outside** on church grounds. Please maintain social distancing.
- Due to space limitations, we ask that no more than 2 people at a time in our restrooms. It is important that we make every effort to abide with social distancing.

#### **Screening Questions:**

- Have you recently developed any of these symptoms <u>without a known cause</u>?
   Cough, fever or chills, congestion or running nose, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, body aches or fatigue, new loss of taste or smell, nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea, sore throat, severe headaches
- 2. Have you been exposed to COVID-19 and told to quarantine?
- 3. Have you returned from any high-risk domestic areas, as described by NY\*, in the last 14 days?
- 4. Have you returned from a foreign country in the last 14 days?
- 5. Have you had a positive COVID test in the last 28 days?

\*NY State high-risk domestic areas (as of 10/6): Alabama, Alaska, Arkansas, Colorado, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Guam, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Carolina, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Puerto Rico, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Wyoming

#### Message from Outreach:

It's November already, the month of giving and giving thanks. We have several opportunities to do both.



First, due to Covid concerns, our Thanksgiving Basket program will be much different this year. Instead of supplying frozen turkeys and all the fixins for a Thanksgiving dinner to a specific number of families, we will be accepting monetary donations to assist the Greece Ecumenical Food Shelf in purchasing Aldi's gift cards for needy families: a family of 3-5 = \$40; a family of 6-8 = \$50; a family of 9 or more = \$60. One idea: we can contribute what we would've spent on the purchase of food. All donations should be turned in by Sunday, November 1. Please make out checks to the Greece Ecumenical Food Shelf, and designate "Thanksgiving Basket" on the memo line. Place the labeled envelope in the collection plate or in the Outreach mailbox. (Sorry for the late notice; we did not realize the deadline would be so early.)

> Second, we will also be supporting the **Red Bird Mission** again, but that has changed, too. Since shoeboxes are in short supply and there is no drop-off site anywhere near us, we decided to help defray the cost of transporting the goods to Kentucky. Outreach has made a \$200

donation, and we are giving you the opportunity to contribute if you would like to. The **deadline** is Sunday, November 15. Checks should be made out to Endwell United Methodist Church. I will collect the checks and mail them to the church.

The Red Bird Missionary Conference is one of three United Methodist missionary conferences in the United States. It is the most comprehensive mission effort of the United Methodist Church, providing outreach and services that minister to the whole person (spiritual, physical, social, and economic).





Our church finances have continued to look "okay" because you, our members, have continued to make your contributions, tithes and offerings. Thanks be to you and to God!







I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. --Philippians 4:12

C.S. Lewis added his own twist to this verse in Philippians when he said "We ought to give thanks for all fortune: if it is 'good,' because it is good, if 'bad' because it works in us patience, humility, and the contempt of this world and the hope of our eternal country."

For me, the key phrase in Lewis's quote is "works in us". Doesn't that have a soul-wrenching ring to it? It reminds me of when my mom would run water-soaked clothes through the wringer to extract the liquid; they would come out flat as a crepe. After they'd hung in the sunlight to dry, she would press them on her Ironrite (electric ironer). Fat heated rollers pressed the wrinkles into oblivion. The clothes looked and smelled better, but what an excruciating process.

Grateful people are so winsome one can't help but be drawn to them. I've noted that these folks are those who have been wrung out with grief and pressed to the limits with hardships yet have come forth with grateful hearts. Of course, some emerge from suffering bitter, caustic, and volatile. The suffering process doesn't guarantee a sweet spirit. But if we're willing to believe that the Lord is at work in us for good in every situation, then we might begin to relate to Madame Guyon who, after many years of imprisonment, penned, "My Lord, how full of sweet content; I pass my years of banishment."

Lord, work in me gratitude.




