



Message from the Pastor:

O Lord, you have searched me and known me. (Psalm 139:1)

I participate in the Burial with Dignity program of the Greater Rochester Coalition of Churches. Together, we provide a graveside service for persons with no known family or friends, or with no resources. There are volunteers who come to the grave to recognize the sacred worth of every individual human life, and to represent all those who knew the person in their life, and who might mourn their death. They bring flowers; we read scripture, pray, sing, and proclaim the hope that is in Jesus. Occasionally, caregivers from a nursing facility might attend. Most times, however, there is no one present who knew the person. Several pastors volunteer to lead the services; I usually lead 2-3 services per year.

Once, I did a service for a man who had lived under a false name for many years. When he died, it became known that he was not the person he had said he was. However, the authorities could not determine who he truly was. As it says on the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington Cemetery, he was “known only to God.”

Psalm 139 proclaims that God knows the author of the Psalm – and by extension, each one of us. The Psalm proclaims that God knows what we’re up to – not in a “*You better watch out...Santa Claus is coming to town*” sort of way, but in the way that a mother stays aware of what her toddler is doing. God cares for us, for our well-being, our safety, and our peace. We may wander off, but God is aware of us, even when we sense that we are lost. We may try to get away and hide, but as when a toddler sticks her head under a blanket, God is not fooled. Nowhere, among the living or the dead, on land or sea or air, is there a place where God will ignore us, or cease to care for us. God has loved us and cared for us from the very beginning of our existence, proclaims the Psalmist.

So, the man who had successfully hidden his identity from people was, I expect, greeted by his true name as he crossed the threshold from life to life eternal.

May each of us find comfort and peace in the love and care of God, and the assurance that (as Paul says in Romans 8:39) nothing in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

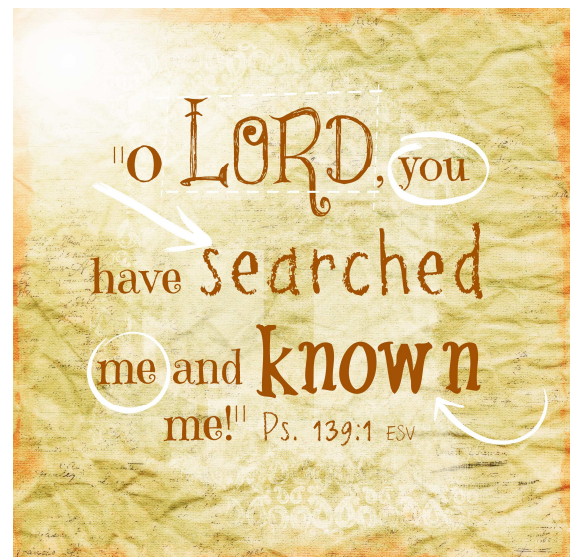

Big News for all of us! Please read this!!! Thoughts from Deacon Dee

Esther is a woman in the Old Testament who in her moment of accomplishment said, "For such a time as this God placed me here." I pray you have noticed at Greece UMC we are trying to figure out the "why" of what we are as a church and in this community. Just like other things of the past it is time to look around and say we must evolve or be left behind. Do you know Blacksmiths were the first to become mechanics when the automobile arrived and it was obvious there was change coming? Many of you are making a difference on your own... living out a call of some kind to care and reach out to others. I have felt your support of me over the past couple years as I have been part time. Especially over the past year with 2 churches to serve over 1 hour 15 minutes apart. The miracle is I have been able to pay my bills and still do what my soul longs for...to Love and serve others. A couple years ago I prepared to preach on Matthew 25. The story of the sheep and the goats is pretty clear what is expected of us if we follow God in living our lives. Read Matthew 25 sometime. These words hit me very hard as I have always believed the church was a community together to grow and learn and then go do it! Jesus said: "I was hungry and you gave me no meal, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, I was homeless and you gave me no bed, I was shivering and you gave me no clothes, Sick and in prison, and you never visited."

Approaching turning 60, I realized I had a need to return to my roots of helping others in need and what had nudged me to get a social work degree. Now beginning my 10th year at Greece UMC, these words have changed something in my inner being in a new way. I continue to pray that my life and others are affected by them as from 2 years ago when Pastor Brian called me.

For one year I have been serving as Co-Pastor at Seneca Street UMC in Buffalo. The people are all struggling with life on many levels. Economics, addictions, lack of parenting skills and much more affect this basically poor white area of South Buffalo. The church became community center and a beacon of hope for people of poverty. There is not a "normal person" there. They don't even begin to think of church like Greece does. The offering has pennies, nickels, dimes, rolled up dollar bills and on a good Sunday it has \$5.00 total. Seneca Street is known as a place to go in time of need and support. It is place where people care about helping others. The second generation is growing up in the afterschool program and teen center. There are many who now want to give back for what they have received over the years. I have had the pleasure to help align people's skills and gifts to tasks. The people say I have brought spirituality there and for the first time in years there is interest in personal spiritual growth.

Pastor Brian and his wife Cheryl have created a wonderful ministry at Seneca Street for 23 years, but Pastor Brian wants to retire and remain as a co-Pastor in different ways. He has asked me to join in Fulltime Pastoral Ministry at Seneca Street. The Bishop agrees it is a Deacon Appointment for this Mission Church. I will be fulltime but will be uncertain where my salary and package will come from in the future. There is neither budget nor regular income. The place has been blessed with donations and that is how they stay open. Shared Ministry monies from our church and others have helped over the past few years to supplement the salary package but that will be going away due to churches not paying conference shared ministries. I thank God we do. I pray and know all will be well and people will sponsor me as a missionary when the time comes so I will receive salary. **It was just approved and officially in this appointment year, I begin January 1, 2018 as Lead Pastor of Seneca Street. I will need to leave Greece UMC in December 2017.**

God has been on this journey with me all along. In Buffalo, I stay at 2 homes of friends from a church where I served in the late 80s and 90s. Turns out both friends are Trustees and the new Pastor does not want the parsonage provided. They offered it to me. Beginning October 1, I will live in Amherst and commute to Greece. This month I have moved out of my apartment to be able to pay off bills and will be arriving in January to serve at Seneca Street with only rent and car payment as my bills.

More info will be coming. I knew the word would be getting out as some know do this being a small world and people share...I have enjoyed my time with you all and will treasure the months to come. These months coming will be important to Greece UMC as we move forward to revise who you are and staffing needs. I believe this is a good time for Greece to rethink ministry.

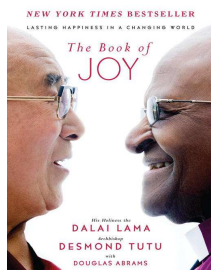

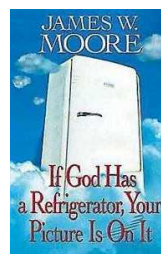

GUMW: 150 Legacy Fund—part 3-Where Does Our Money Go?

For the last of our series on the **Legacy 150 Fund**, here are some examples of what UMW does with the money it collects. This, of course, involves the National Office of UMW, Inc., which is the direct recipient of the Legacy Fund donations. For our local unit, the money we receive from pledges and fundraising, i.e., bazaar and clothing sale only, goes towards our pledge to the National Office through the District and the UMW Upper NY Conference. Our local unit also supports the Church Budget, Chococente, UM Student Day as well as local organizations, such as Open Door Mission, Salem Nutrition Center, Journey Home, Church Women United and the Greece Food Shelf.

Our national and international efforts broadly support advocacy programs for women, children and youth as well as support for deaconesses, home missionaries and regional missionaries, educational and spiritual growth programs, to name a few. The Reading Program and Response magazine are examples of educational initiatives. One of our Reading Program books entitled "Soul Repair" tells of a UMW-sponsored scholarship program at Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary called UMW Women of Color Scholars Program which enabled a very talented young woman to pastor a South Chicago church.

Along with UMW, the Outreach Committee and the efforts of many of our members' donations of time and money, MISSION is alive and well at Greece United Methodist Church. As the sign on our door indicates, you are entering the "mission field" when you leave the confines of our building. Thank you to all who support missions.
