A Message from our Pastor:

I want their hearts to be encouraged and united in love, so that they may have all the riches of assured understanding and have the knowledge of God's mystery, that is, Christ himself.

(Colossians 2:2)

As my secretary was on vacation one summer (not at Greece, but at a previous church), I sat her desk, using the computer. On a small piece of paper on the desk a note was written: "United", not "Untied." I am not sure exactly why the note was there, perhaps a mistake had been made that she did not want to repeat. Whatever the reason was, it caught my attention and got me thinking. It is one of those mistakes that a spellchecker program would not pick up, because it is a substitution of one real word for another. It is also a very important mistake, because it changes the character of who we are. The error would make us the *Untied* Methodist Church.

This is a small error, except for the fact that *United* and *Untied* have opposite meanings. One is what we want to be; the other, what we want to avoid becoming. What I find interesting, and instructive, is what makes the difference in these two words, and indeed in these two concepts: it is the position of "i." Where "i" is (I am?) makes all the difference. It is an attitude thing. If I (and all the other "I's" that make up "We") see myself as part of a whole, then we are bound to one another – we are <u>united</u>. If I am committed only to myself, and my way, and my opinion, then we are united.

The apostle Paul, in writing to the church at Corinth (see 1 Corinthians 12) used the concept of the church as a body. The parts of the body are not, nor can they be, identical. Yet they make one whole; they experience pleasure and pain together. Stub your toe, and see whether that small part experiences the event by itself. Kiss your beloved, and see whether the mouth alone responds to that pleasure.

Like Paul, and Jesus before him, my hope and prayer is that we may be one, *united* and not *untied*. This does not mean that we should all be alike, or think alike. It means that we should learn and develop the Spiritual Gifts that God has given each of us. It means recognizing the different personality characteristics that each of us has as a gift from God, and choosing opportunities for ministry that compliment those characteristics. It does not even mean that we should all be in agreement all the time. It does mean that we should respect and care for one another, and commit to being one church together – the Body of Christ in this place and time – the *United* Methodist Church.

#### Thoughts from Dee:

We are a church in transition. As we journey together, we know we are not who we were in the 60's and 70's. We are a people of God and as such, we know we cannot continue as we did 50 years ago. 200 years ago it was necessary for the church to step in and teach on Sunday mornings as children worked 6 long days a week and Sunday was the only day off. They learned to read and write with the bible.

I recall being at a Christian Educators' Conference 25 years ago and hear a prophet say: Sunday school is dying and will not be around in 20 years. There was a gasp and chatter through the 800 people gathered. No way. It has been and will be so and we will make it continue. Years later we realize that for most churches, it has come to pass that Sunday morning is no longer the time to gather for Christian Education. Sports and other activities have made Sunday just another day and for many, it is a day of relaxing and about us, - not about taking time to worship God.

Since I arrived, we have seen changes in the Christian Education opportunities. We had children, but no youth in classes. Now, we have lots of youth and few children who come on Sunday mornings. We are discovering that we have children in worship who leave for Children's Church. This is the one time we have them - as they do not come earlier for Sunday School. This Fall, we will begin to have a Children's Church team of people who will rotate to provide this second Sunday School program. The program will be based on the Scripture lesson in worship.

Thank you all who have helped in any way in the nursery and Children's Church during worship. We are on this faith journey together and need to continue to evaluate and plan for the future.

It's hard to believe that Fall is just around the corner and our church activities will go back into full swing. As you might expect, our financial intake goes down in the summer as folks take vacations etc. For the church to support its full schedule, your financial support, along with your involvement, are vital. Over the last few years, we've seen several encouraging signs including our youth taking on some special programs. Some of which have involved out of country mission projects, Johnson City work efforts and just plain involvement in and around the church. Our Outreach Committee supports many local needs. We've taken a leadership role in financing and building 5 Habitat homes and hope to see the start of a 6<sup>th</sup> later this Fall. Your support of the First Sunday giving to help support our Budget is important. As you recall, we asked for \$10 additional each First Sunday, or whatever you could afford. Not too far down the road, we'll be requesting your commitment for 2014 giving. I recently received a mailing that included a sample giving card with "A Step of Faith" chart in it with income and % of giving from, along with a suggested increase from your present giving with the suggestion of a 10% increase from this year's giving. 
