Pastor's Message:

For surely | know the plans | have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. (Jeremiah 29:11)

This passage from Jeremiah is one that I turn to frequently, and I try to incorporate into my thinking and my approach to life. Sometimes I succeed, and sometimes I have a little more trouble in living it out – approaching the future with hope in the Lord. Jeremiah wrote these words – God's words – in a letter to a people with no reason to hope. They had been taken away into exile after being conquered by the Babylonians, the biggest, baddest, evil empire of that age. They had no reason to believe that they would ever be a distinct people again. They had every reason to fear "ethnic cleansing". Their king, their government, their capital city, and their center of worship were all gone, and they were far from home.

Yet they found a way to live in their "new normal". They set about to preserve faith in God and reverence of God, even though they could not worship in the way they always had in the Temple. They set about to preserve the stories, the traditions, and the commandments that had been passed down in the midst of everyday life, and remembered word for word by a few. They wrote out the scriptures that we know as the Old Testament so that they would not disappear. They gathered in neighborhood "synagogues" to share prayers, and the scriptures, and ways that these stories and traditions related to their current situation, much like a protestant church service today. They were in exile for about 50 years before a small band was allowed to set out to rebuild Jerusalem and the Temple. But they lived under the government of whatever empire controlled their land for most of the next 25 centuries.

This year begins in a time of "new normal" for us. The Covid-19 pandemic has changed an awful lot of the way we live our lives. It has certainly changed the way we have been worshipping. Unlike the people of Jeremiah's time, however, we have hope that we will return to some close version of the life we led before the pandemic. Some of the things we have learned during these months of isolation and separation may serve us well in the future. The use of technology for work and meetings may well continue for many. The new science that has brought vaccines to us quicker than ever will aid us in future epidemics. The need to be prepared has been recognized by more than just preppers and the Boy Scouts. The importance of friendship and family has been highlighted for us.

Most of all, many of us have a renewed sense of God with us in the midst of daily living. Deprived of person-to-person contact, many have recognized God "beside them to guide them." Even though we do not know all that the future will bring, we can look forward in hope, trusting that God has plans for us – plans to look out for us and not cause us trouble. God's plans for the people of Jeremiah's time were to give them "a future with hope." 25 centuries later, we can read Jeremiah's letter to the exiles and find hope for ourselves. All the more, because 500 years after Jeremiah, God sent Jesus, the one we know as Emmanuel, "God with us!", to put an exclamation point on the promise.

As we enter this New Year, we can trust that God has plans for us, plans for our welfare and not for harm, to give us a future with hope. May it be so.



Greece United Methodist COVID In-person Guidelines

Requirements: Facial Masks, Screening, Temperatures, Social Distancing

Available: Masks, Hand Sanitizer, Cleansing Wipes

Not Available: Sunday School, Children's Church, Nursery, Bulletins, Pew Bibles, Hymnals,

Guest Sign-in Books, Offering plates,

Process:

- Limited access into the building Only use of the main entrance located off the parking lot (Kings Common)
- Doors will be opened (weather permitted) 30 mins before the service and kept open.
- Screening table will be at the entrance of the building. You must stop at a screening table before entering the building.
- You will be asked a series of pre-screening questions, your temperature will be taken (100.3 or below accepted), and sign-in attendance (for contact tracing) will be taken before entering the building.
- We will be counting attendees to make sure we do not exceed capacity requirements.
- Name tags will be available on outside table. Congregation will take their name tags with them after the service and will be responsible for the care of them. It is recommended that you wear you name tag when possible. It is difficult to recognize people with their masks on. (Suggestion: Leave in your vehicle so you have it each week.)
- After screening, proceed directly to the sanctuary where an usher will seat you/family in a social distance approved pew.
- Tithing box will be inside sanctuary doors.
- At the end of the service, ushers will release congregation one pew at a time. Please proceed directly to parking lot.
- Non-touch socializing should be before and after the service, outside on church grounds.
 Please maintain social distancing.
- Due to space limitations, we ask that no more than 2 people at a time in our restrooms. It is important that we make every effort to abide with social distancing.

Screening Questions:

- Have you recently developed any of these symptoms <u>without a known cause</u>?
 Cough, fever or chills, congestion or running nose, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, body aches or fatigue, new loss of taste or smell, nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea, sore throat, severe headaches
- 2. Have you been exposed to COVID-19 and told to quarantine?
- 3. Have you returned from any high-risk domestic areas, as described by NY*, in the last 14 days?
- 4. Have you returned from a foreign country in the last 14 days?
- 5. Have you had a positive COVID test in the last 28 days?

This year's trip to the Red Bird Mission was very successful. We took 2,025 shoeboxes filled with personal hygiene items, 25 boxes of diapers, over 75 new sheet sets, over 100 backpacks filled with school supplies, handmade scarves, and other miscellaneous items. We drove one 26-foot truck to Kentucky and intend to take another 26-foot truck with clothing and food sometime in March of 2021.

This year we kept a record of the hours and miles put into this mission. Our drivers drove approximately 4, 662 miles picking up donations throughout the Upper New York Conference and driving to Kentucky. The team spent over 400 hours on this mission.

As we look forward to next year's mission, we would like churches to consider donating shoeboxes, backpacks, new blankets and sheet sets, and diapers. The need for clothing is not as critical this time of year as the warehouse at the mission is usually full of gently used clothes. New clothes will still be taken to the Community Outreach Center for distribution.

Once again, I would like to personally thank all of you for your support of this vital mission. It is such a good feeling to know how God works to provide for those in
