I have some news that I knew would come at some point, but I hoped it would not come so soon. I had been notified by a staff member with Trinity Y2K that two members of their household have become ill. The staff person is fine. Both family members have had fevers, one had diarrhea. All family members are being tested today. This person will be in isolation until the test results come back negative.

In an abundance of caution, we have made the difficult decision to close Trinity Y2K until the test results come back negative. If they are positive, we have been in the mandatory 14-day closing.

Effective when we re-open I am requiring all staff to wear face coverings, either masks or face shields. We are going to encourage camp children to wear them as well. The nursery and two-year-old classroom children are not required to wear masks.

The COVID-19 cases in Horry County are increasing drastically, and I feel these extra steps may help stop the spread if it does end up in our center.

There will be no charge for tuition during this closure. If you have paid in advance that tuition paid will be applied to future tuition, or you may request a refund.

Please contact me if you have any questions.

Remember, if you or your child are not feeling well, please do not send your child to day care/camp. Help stop the spread of COVID-19.
