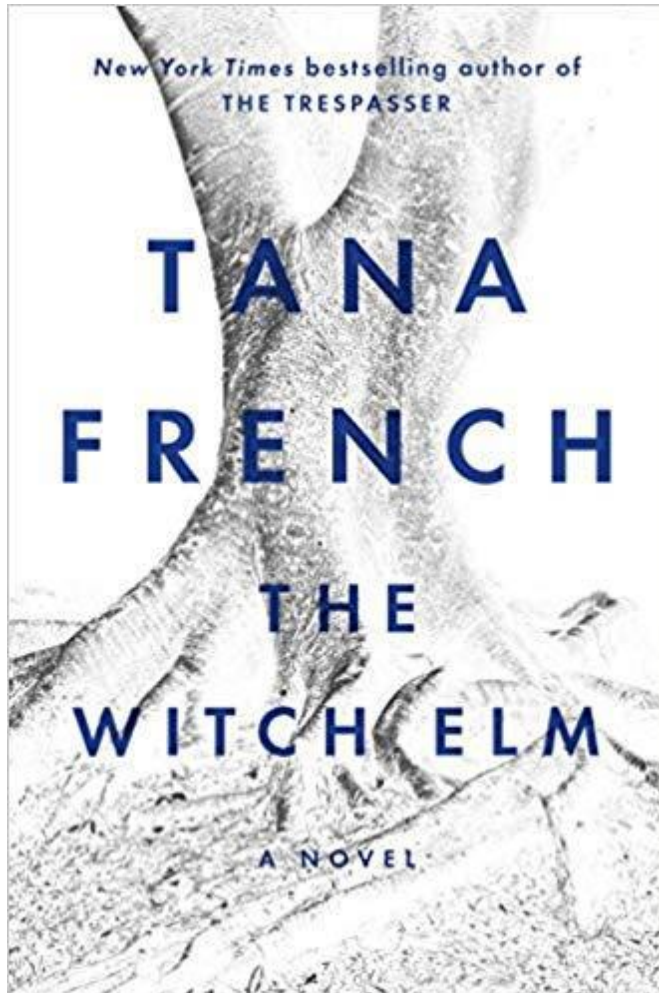


Trinity Book Club—April 2019



The Trinity Book Club is an invitation to read a book each month that has captured your pastor's attention long enough to finish it. Pastor Tony welcomes those who read the book and loved it (or hated), started the book and didn't quite finish it, or even just put it in their Amazon shopping cart to come enjoy a conversation with him and others from the Trinity about each month's book.

Tana French is an American-Irish writer who lives in Dublin. She is best-known for her *Dublin Murder Squad* series of murder mystery novels. Her new novel, *The Witch Elm*, is a stand-alone story that looks like a murder mystery—a brutal beating, a skull in a tree, etc.—but it is really a deeply subtle book about privilege: how clueless, apparently decent guys can float through life unaware of the injustices around them, sometimes even ones they have committed. "One gets into the habit of being oneself," says one character. "It takes some great upheaval to crack that shell and force us to discover what else might be underneath." This is also a story where luck haunts the characters every step of the way.

We will meet to discuss that assertion and our reaction to the novel on **Thursday, May 2** at 11 AM. We are meeting a week later this month to allow Pastor Tony some recovery time following Holy Week and Easter.
