A few weeks ago, I stood in the back of our worship facility and saw a beautiful thing. The youth were singing, praising, and having a time of joy as they were meeting with God. During DNOW, a good many youth, and youth leaders, stood side by side and worshipped together. What a joyous time!

In a few weeks, we will host a Senior Adult Conference to honor, encourage, and challenge our seniors of the area to live strong in faith. I'm sure I'll experience some of the same emotions. I'm sure joy will be palpable, and worship will be sweet. I am looking forward to this event, maybe more, than the seniors of the area.

Having an event to bring the youth together in worship is a good thing. Having an event to bring the senior adults together in worship is a good thing. But do you know what a GREAT thing would be? A church where children, youth, young adults, middle aged adults, and senior adults ALL come together to worship the One and Only Lord of Lords as one. A weekly gathering of the whole where the age does not define flavor of worship, but where each flavor of worship blends together in praise to the Holy One.

Do you know what prohibits such an ongoing gathering? Preferences. We are quick to let our preferences become more important than our neighbors. Correct me if I'm wrong, but I think Paul had differences of opinions in mind when he wrote to the church of Rome to say, "Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another;" (Romans 12:10). The short of it; don't love your preferences more than you love the soul of another!

The church, our church, should be a weekly gathering of singing and praising, worship and excitement, preaching and teaching, for everyone. It should be a space where we "rejoice with those who rejoice" and we celebrate the work of God in others. As John looked across the population of heaven, he saw people from "every tribe and tongue and people and nation" (Revelation 5). Let me assure you, God loves variety. His preference is for everyone. So should ours be.

It is a good thing to have separate functions as "like attracts like". But that won't build a dynamic, diverse church. What will? That's the question I want you asking. How do we have an attitude like Paul that we might, "become all things to all men, that I (we) might by all means save some. Now this I do for the gospel's sake...(1 Corinthians 9:22-23). Ask yourself, how do we win our children? Our grandchildren? An unchurched generation around us? Start asking the question. I believe God loves to give answers.

It was a long trip. My youngest son and I were traveling back from Norfolk, Virginia on dark backroads at about 9pm, March 17, 2017. We were 20 minutes away from home when everything suddenly changed. Twirling, spinning, rolling, and then a complete stop upside down in my truck. My son walked away from the car accident unharmed, but I was not so fortunate. I sustained major head injuries and cracked ribs. My life and family were thrown without warning into complete chaos. But God's love and presence was there that evening. Through prayers and support from my church, family, and friends, I recovered quickly. Unfortunately, many will face a global chaos that will happen suddenly even though they were forewarned for many years that it was coming! Millions of people will vanish from the earth and for those left behind, life as they knew it will be changed forever.

"For you yourselves know perfectly that the day of the Lord so comes as a thief in the night. For when they say, "Peace and safety!" then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labor pains upon a pregnant woman. And they shall not escape." Ist Thessalonians 5:2-3 (NKJV)

The lyrics to the above song were originally written about the outcome of drunk driving, but I also believe it could also relate to suicide and depression. I hear and see the words now in a different way when I think of the Rapture and its effect on the lives of those who will be left behind. We have all seen a movie or read a book about what might happen when Jesus comes to remove His followers from the earth. And I am sure many have heard sermons and descriptions of the events following the Rapture. In 2021 we had the pandemic, riots, mayhem, and hatred towards police, Christians, and other nationalities. In 2022, we have inflation, energy crisis, and Russia going to war with Ukraine, and many other issues. It is hard to believe all that is happening now, but I cannot fathom the depth of chaos to follow or the outcry of those who will witness the destruction, the outpouring of evil and disorder, and the coming wrath of God (Rev 6-19) after the Rapture. Now, more than ever, we need to be a witness and share the gospel!!

God does not want ANYONE to face His wrath in the coming tribulation (John 3:16-17). The convergence of end time events prophesied in the Bible are proceeding at a faster pace each day. "When these things begin to take place, stand up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." (Luke 21:28)


