# Legend of the Donkey's Cross

A poor farmer near Jerusalem owned a donkey far too small to do much work at all. He felt that he could not afford to feed a worthless animal like this, one that could do him no good whatsoever, so at the supper table he told his family that he was going to kill the donkey.

His children, who loved the little donkey, begged him to sell it rather than harm it. But the farmer said, "It is wrong to sell an animal that can't do a good day's work."

Then his oldest daughter suggested, "Father, tie the donkey to a tree on the road to town, and say whoever wants it may take it for nothing." And the next morning, that's what the farmer did.

Soon, two men approached and asked if they could have the donkey. "It can carry almost nothing," the farmer warned them. "Jesus of Nazareth has need of it," replied one of the men. The farmer couldn't imagine what a great teacher would want with such a worthless donkey, but he handed it over.

The men took the animal to Jesus, who stroked the grateful donkey's face and then mounted it and rode away. So it was on the day we call Palm Sunday, Jesus led his followers into the city of Jerusalem riding on the back of the small, common donkey.

The donkey so loved his gentle master that he later followed him to Calvary. Griefstricken by the sight of Jesus on the cross, the donkey turned away but couldn't bring himself to leave. As the sun came across the sky the shadow of the cross fell upon the shoulders and back of the little donkey, and there it stayed. All donkeys have borne the sign of the cross on their backs since that very day.



True to a donkey's spirit once they befriend you, they are yours for life. In the legend the donkey refused to leave Jesus. On that day the donkey stayed true to Jesus as they will with you. It is known, when a donkey loses a life-long mate they will often stand in the spot where the other donkey died for hours at a time. Even months or years after they have passed. 4 large zucchini or summer squash

Bake 9-10 min. Turn broiler on high and broil until golden brown 2-3 min.

### Lord, Prepare Me

#### Lord, prepare me to be a sanctuary Pure and holy, tried and true With thanksgiving, I'll be a living Sanctuary for You

The chorus above has been a favorite among church worship services since it was written in 1982. At the end of May of 2020, after following recommendations of suspending our church services and providing virtual services for two months, we started public worship services again by meeting in the Fellowship Hall by following the protocols of social distancing and guidelines to meet safely due to the recent Covid-19 outbreak. Recent conversations concerning the return to our church sanctuary has caused me great concern, but not because of Covid-19. Let me first state I fully look forward to the day we return to worship in our church sanctuary. We are blessed with a beautiful place of worship, but will we return with the right focus. The word sanctuary means, "A place set aside as sacred and holy, especially a place of worship." The meaning of this song now becomes, Lord prepare my life to be a sacred and holy place of worship!

I am one who believes that worship takes place wherever the spirit of the Lord is worshipped, His name is praised, and the Holy Spirit is present. It is not based on conditions of a place, personal preferences, the right technology, or a great speaker. God can speak to the heart even in faulty worship services, if we prepare to worship. I have even experienced worship while driving my car. Recent comments such as "I can't worship because (the seats are uncomfortable, it is too hot/cold, of the technology issues, the message is not feeding me, the songs they sing, etc.)." These complaints were about our church sanctuary but now they have become about our present location in the fellowship hall. One person even joked that worshipping in the Fellowship Hall was like having church in the cafeteria.

Have we made our church sanctuary an idol? Do we truly believe we can tell God "these are my conditions for worship?" The Bible gives us the history of the Israelites failures to honor, worship, and follow God, and we are doomed to repeat their mistakes if we don't repent. In Isaiah 5 and Jeremiah 5-6 the prophets warn the nation of Judah of their sins and called on them to repent or face the consequences of their rebellion. Isaiah 5 speaks of their injustice (vs.7), greed (vs.8), pleasure seeking (vs.12), blasphemy (vs.19), moral perversion (vs.20), pride (vs.21), intemperance (vs.22), and political corruption (vs.22). Jeremiah 5-6 states the same but adds three more to the list with immorality (5:7-8), religious corruption (5:30-31), and closed minds (6:10-11).

How did the people respond to Jeremiah's warning? We read in Jeremiah 7:3-4, "This is what the Lord Almighty, the God of Israel, says: Reform your ways and your actions, and I will let you live in this place. Do not trust in deceptive words and say, 'This is the temple of the Lord, the temple of the Lord, the temple of the Lord!" The people of Judah believed that God would never allow His Temple (sanctuary) to be destroyed because His Glory resided in there. They had placed their acts of worship and faith in a building. Both prophets called on the people to repent, but in the end they rejected to follow and obey the Lord. Soon thereafter, just as prophesied, the Temple was utterly destroyed and the Israelites were conquered, captured, and scattered by the Babylonian Empire.

There can be no greater ambition for a follower of Christ than to be a living sanctuary. With a true understanding of eternity and the saving grace of Jesus, our life only has real purpose as we live each day to bring Him glory and honor – by living each moment in praise and worship, no matter what circumstances may come. The way we walk through our trials as well as how we accomplish our daily tasks, ministry activities, or times of prayer and study should all be done through a heart devoted to worship. Let's allow our soul to sing out with praise and worship – not just for a few set hours each week, but every day with every word, thought and deed. Let's patiently trust Him in all areas of our life (**Proverbs 3:5-6**) and ask our Father to teach us to live as a living sanctuary.

"Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship." Romans 12:1 (NIV)

As the easter season approaches each year, we focus on different aspects of the crucifixion story a little closer as we share to others. As I was reading in Luke chapter 22, I came to verses 39-46 where we read of Jesus's prayer on the mount of olives. We read how Jesus takes Peter, James and John into the garden to pray and He commands them to "Pray that you may not enter into temptation." When Jesus comes back to them, He finds them sleeping and asks them "Why are you sleeping?" and again tells them to "Rise and pray that you may not enter into temptation."

Was Jesus asking them to pray on his behalf? No, He told them to pray that they would not enter into temptation. What temptation? They were about to face a test of their loyalty to Jesus as His disciples. They were not prepared for what was about to happen. They had enjoyed life up until this point with things going well with Jesus by their side. They had watched His miracles and had been a part of doing miracles under His authority, now they were about to face an turn of events that Jesus had told them about, but they didn't understand. They were given an opportunity to take a stand with Jesus as His disciples, as His friends and His followers and they didn't. They gave into the temptation of denial.

In looking at this for us today, I believe Jesus is telling us the same as Paul writes in 1 Thess. 5 about the coming "Day of the Lord" and the judgement that will come upon the unsaved and he Follows this with simple but direct commands of how we as believers are to live our lives in order to be a testimony to the world, including verse 17, "pray without ceasing."

We do not know the all that we will face as believers in the coming days and years of our lives, but we do know that if we do not "Rise and Pray," we too will not be ready to be a testimony to the unsaved world we live in!
