As I write, Jim Johnson is preparing to conclude his challenge to First Baptist Church of Pelham to be a God centered church. Tonight will be his last night with us. I pray that the challenge has been received. For you know as well as I, we all have a tendency to revert back to ourselves as the source and expert in decisions. "I think" are the two most common words formed when decisions are on the table. But scripture calls us to become fully reliant upon God's ways and not our natural tendencies. [Galatians 2:20 NKJV] "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me."

Notice the underlined parts of the previous verse. We either live by faith or we live by flesh. Either Christ lives through us or we live unto ourselves. The only thing we can actually place faith in is God, and what He has spoken. Through His Word, through His Spirit, through prayer, that's the source where we find what God desires to do through us. It is my prayer that all decisions of FBC Pelham are established in faith and centered upon God.
