

Clergy's Corner

February 1, 2021

Dear Sisters, Brothers, and Siblings in Christ,

Rarely have God's mysteries felt more troubling or more mysterious. During international suffering and national struggle, I am not comforted when I hear that God works in mysterious ways. I want to experience God's certainty, Christ's guidance, and the Holy Spirit's comfort - especially right now.

Instead, we are entering Lent. The traditional Lenten sacrifices - prayer, fasting, and almsgiving - feel more demanding during a pandemic. Haven't we sacrificed enough?

Maybe Lent 2021 requires us to reframe sacrifice. "Sacrifice" is related to "sacred," to set apart, to make holy.

How can we reframe the sacrifice of prayer? Perhaps we could pray for an end to human suffering.

How can we reframe the sacrifice of fasting? Perhaps we could fast from injustice and division.

How can we reframe the sacrifice of almsgiving? Perhaps we could offer alms of doubt and despair.

Lent can be challenging, even in non-pandemic times. Lent 2021 is uniquely challenging, especially as we wonder, "Haven't we sacrificed enough?"

Let us pray that God blesses our sacrifices, makes them holy, and sets them apart to Christ's greater glory.
