God is omnipotent, all powerful.

Since NASA put the Hubble telescope in orbit around our planet we have learned that there are hundreds of billions of other galaxies in the universe. And each galaxy is made up of more than 100 billion stars. The universe is much bigger than we thought. That means it consists of more energy than we thought. That means that God is even more powerful than we thought. God holds in his hands more than all the energy in the universe.

God's power is unlimited in four significant ways:

- A. He made all things and all things serve him. They serve his purposes.

 "Your laws endure to this day, for all things serve you." Psalm 119:91
- B. He does whatever he pleases. Everything he does is his choice. He is not forced to react to us. No outside power can make God do something he does not choose to do.
 "Our God is in heaven; he does whatever pleases him." Psalm 115:3
- C. No one <u>can stop</u> God's plans. We read in the OT of some who try. They always fail. "I know that you can do all things; no plan of yours can be thwarted." Job 42:2
- D. Nothing is too hard for God.

"For nothing is impossible with God." Luke 1:37

There is nothing God cannot do. He can create things by speaking them into existence. He can hold the sun in the hollow of his hand. He can create worlds or destroy them with a single word. He can create life or end life as easily as you or I blink. He can heal

any disease or infirmity or handicap. He can feed the entire world without growing or killing anything.

There is no evil that God cannot overcome. He can nullify the effects of nuclear weapons. He can defeat any army without firing a shot. He can defeat any army without firing a shot. God is stronger than all of the bad guys. He can make every weapon misfire every time.
