## MUCH TO BE THANKFUL FOR

### I. The Scriptures

The Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is God's revelation of Himself to man. It is a perfect treasure of divine instruction. **Colossians 2:6-7 (NIV)** So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and **overflowing with thankfulness.**

The Bible commentator, Dr. Matthew Henry, was once robbed as he walked along a highway. Afterwards he told his friends there were four things for which he gave thanks.

First, he was grateful that he had never been robbed before. After many years of life this was the first time he had been robbed and for that he was grateful.

Secondly, he said, "Though they took all my money, I am glad they did not get very much." That was something to be thankful for.

Thirdly, he said, "Though they took my money, they did not take my life, and I am grateful for that."

And finally, he suggested, "I am thankful that it was I who was robbed, and not I who robbed."

This was a man who had learned how to be "overflowing with thankfulness!" May we all learn how to be so thankful for all of our blessings.
