MAKING AN IMPACT

This past year our church made an impact with Christ on many people. A few highlights:

Community Impact Report for 2018

- 550 Meals delivered to Lighthouse Shelter
- 64 Children attending at least one day of VBS
- 25 Vacation Bible School workers
- CD's with VBS music delivered to 37 families, 16 of which do not attend a church or Bible Study.
- 94 People/families helped with financial needs: rent (50), utilities (43), other (4)
- The Christian Assistance Program (CAP) served 1,753 families of 5,159 individuals.
- 49 Backpacks with school supplies delivered to children at Waugh Chapel
- Holiday Sharing - 4 families and 1 senior helped for Thanksgiving and Christmas

- \$ 13,587 contributed through the Cooperative Program to the Baptist Convention of Maryland and Delaware (\$7,065) and to the Southern Baptist Convention (\$6,522) for missionaries, seminaries, and other.
- \$ 1,359 contributed to the Arundel Baptist Network
- \$ 6,277 through special missions offerings
