One thing we learn in counseling classes is that anger is a secondary emotion. That means when we are angry, is it because we are feeling something else, some other emotion, first. I have been angry this past week. But when I reflect on that anger, I realize that I am angry because I am heartbroken. I am angry because I am exhausted and exasperated. I am angry because I feel powerless against the division and violence and hatred that is permeating our society right now.

This week, a 17-year-old was arrested in Illinois and charged with murder because it appears as if this boy was walking the streets of Kenosha, Wisconsin the night before with a long gun, which he then used to fire into a crowd of protesters, killing two and wounding another. What do we even do with this? What kind of society have we created when a 17-year-old child (and he absolutely is a child) feels like he needs to walk the streets of a city armed and ready to kill people? This is not something that should be applauded. This is not the world I want to raise my child in. This is not the world I want for any of our children.

Rather than point fingers and assign blame, I think every single one of us needs to stop and think about how we have contributed to this culture of hatred and division and violence, because we absolutely all have. If not directly by our actions, then by our inaction. We need to, and I'm going to use a very churchy word here: repent. We need to turn and go a different direction. God is weeping right now. God is weeping for lives lost, God is weeping for that 17-year-old boy who pulled the trigger, and God is calling us to set aside our hatred and division to work in the name of God's love for peace and reconciliation.

I know that none of us is perfect. We are all broken. We are all fallible. We get it wrong more often than we get it right. But we are absolutely better than this. God help us, we have to be.
